Felixstowe welcomed back Henry Barley to the starting eleven after injury, with Harry Knock at the heart of defence following his recent permanent signing from Ipswich Town. The visitors included forward Derek Asamoah, a former professional at Carlisle United, Lincoln City and Shrewsbury Town.

A minute's silence was observed and the National Anthem played as a mark of respect to the passing of Queen Elizabeth II.

It was clear from the first whistle that Felixstowe were keen to set the tempo of the game and gain control in the middle of the park, they did this quite brilliantly and it was one-way traffic from the off. Noel Aitkens came close to the opener after just 2 minutes, his long-range piledriver from 20 yards just skimming the left post after some great build up play from Lamell Howell, A minute later and it was Aitkens this time turning provider as he set up play on the right and found Callum Harrison in a good position, Harrison turning and shooting wide of the post. Felixstowe's early dominance was rewarded on 7 minutes. Lamell Howell broke forward and was bundled over in the box as he was about to shoot, up stepped Callum Harrison with the penalty, his shot was low and hard but the goalkeeper guessed correctly to





save down to his left but could only send the loose ball back out to Harrison who fired in the rebound to give the Seasiders a deserved lead. New Salamis were struggling to make any impact in the game at all but finally found a way forward on 12 minutes, Asamoah came inside from the left and sent his 22-yard effort just over the crossbar. If the visitors task was already looking difficult, it was looking near impossible on 22 minutes as the away side were reduced to ten men, Jandir Jose rightly seeing red for a high challenge on the edge of the area. Harrison fancied the resulting free kick but his low shot was saved comfortably by Olajide. Henry Barley came close to doubling the Seasiders advantage on 25 minutes, first seeing his curling effort deflected just wide, and then from the corner kick, leathering the ball towards the goal from the edge of the area but seeing his blistering shot go agonisingly inches over the bar. Felixstowe were forced into a change on 35 minutes, Zak Brown unable to run off a strain, with Ollie Canfer coming on to the field. His impact was instant as he doubled



the lead within a minute to finish a fantastic move. Noel Aitkens spread the ball to the right, Callum Bennett put across a perfect cross into **Canfer** who laid it off with his chest before receiving it back in order to smash the ball through the goalkeeper from 10 yards. Harrison sliced just wide on 38 minutes as the pressure continued. New Salamis were given a decent opportunity to finally get into the game on 45 minutes as they won a free kick in a central position, 23 yards from goal, there were loud cheers as the effort from Skandari flew way over the bar and troubled the checkout staff in Tesco in Hamilton Road more than Callum Robinson! Two minutes into first half injury time and it was 3-0, Callum Bennett with another superb delivery in to Canfer whose shot was saved by the body of the keeper before rebounding out to an unmarked **Callum Harrison** on the left who fired into the empty net.

New Salamis found a higher gear for the first 5 minutes of the second half, without creating too much, before Felixstowe once again grabbed the game and didn't let go for the remainder. Harrison shot just over from 20 yards on 50 minutes as he looked for his hat-trick, before Ollie Canfer joined him on two goals 3 minutes later, a bullet cross from the right was met by Canfer in the box and he expertly headed into the far side of the net to finish off any last resistance that the visitors may potentially have mustered. **Canfer** didn't have long to wait for his hat-trick, that came on 66 minutes, 31 playing minutes since his introduction





to the field, and once again it was superb goal to finish off a flowing move from a rampant Felixstowe side, Canfer in the right place at the end to poke the ball under the keeper and into the gaping goal. Harrison fired just over on 70 minutes as the game slowed with Felixstowe happy now to play the ball around and preserve some energy for Tuesday's big game at Sudbury (Now postponed due to an FA Cup replay).

The visitors had their best chance of the match on 72 minutes, Richard Ennin finding space on the right to get into a great position and force a good low save from Callum Robinson, who had been largely redundant thus far. Substitute Harry Blackburn came closest to a sixth goal, his shot from the edge of the area on 75 minutes producing a decent save from Olajide. From there on, no further chances were created by either side, New Salamis no doubt disappointed with their performance after such an impressive start to the league campaign, and Felixstowe more than happy with their five goals and three points as they saw out the game with ease to rise to the top of the Isthmian North.

THE OTHER SIDE MALDON & TIPTREE



In 2009, Ed Garty took over the ownership of Maldon Town from Michael Kirkham, whilst still in charge of running Tiptree United and installed Alan Brockhouse as Maldon Town's new chairman. Following the takeover. Colin Wallington returned for a second spell in charge of Maldon Town, leaving his post as Tiptree United manager immediately. Colin previously managed Maldon Town from 2003 until 2007, having achieved promotion in the 2005-06 via the play-off final. Having left Maldon in 2007, Colin went on to manage Tiptree United where he achieved promotion winning the Eastern Counties Division One title in the 2007/08 season. Until the conclusion of the 2009/10 season both Maldon Town & Tiptree United played their home games at Park Drive, under a ground share arrangement.

In the summer of 2010, Maldon Town & Tiptree United amalgamated to form, Maldon & Tiptree Football Club, under the ownership of Ed Garty. As a result of the amalgamation, Tiptree United withdrew from the Essex Senior League, resulting in the clubs last ever fixture being a 3-1 defeat against Enfield 1893 on 24 April 2010. Maldon & Tiptree took the place of Maldon Town in the Isthmian Division One North.

Following the retirement of Colin Wallington, Assistant Manager, Brad King and Glen Knight were appointed as the clubs Joint-Manager. As the pair's first managerial role, the new club witnessed wholesale changes with only a handful of players remaining who finished the season with Maldon Town and Tiptree United, respectively.

The 2010-11 campaign saw the new club remain in or around the play-off positions for the majority of the season, finishing in eighth place to finish the season with sixty-three points. Despite the high turnover of players, the good standard of football was maintained and it was in the end, a disappointing end to the season, for the club to fall away in the later stages of the season when suspensions and injuries eventually took their toll to leave the club frustratingly short of the play-off positions at the end of April. The 2011-12 season,

ANOREAS CARTE

proved to not be so successful and in November 2011, King and Knight were relieved of their duties with immediate effect. Ex-Charlton professional Mike Flanagan was appointed as Caretaker Manager and remained in place until the end of the season, steering the club to a respectful mid-table finish, managing thirty-three games and finishing with a win percentage of 49.12%.

At the start of the 2012-13 campaign, ex-Stansted & Redbridge boss Terry Spillane was appointed as Manager, and Mike Flanagan departed the club. The change of management, once again brought wholesale changes with the playing squad. Ex Tiptree United manager, Jody was brought to the club as Terry's Assistant Manager. After a fantastic and unbeaten start to the season, the club found themselves at the top of the table but an incredible run by eventual Champions Grays Athletic meant Maldon had to settle for a place in the play-offs - Terry's side remained unbeaten until Boxing Day, when they lost away from home against local rivals Heybridge Swifts. Disappointment came in the play-off final however when they lost a two goal lead to draw with Thamesmead Town, who then went on to win the final, on penalties.

After a disappointing end to the previous season, Terry Spillane oversaw more wholesale changes in the playing squad, including the departure of Assistant Manager, Jody Brown. Despite the changes, Maldon finished in ninth position with seventy-six points, winning twenty-one games.

More changes to the playing staff, resulted in poor start to the 2014-15 season, and the club parted ways with Spillane in September 2014, with Chairman, Ed Garty takeover as Caretaker Manager, for three games. At the end of September 2014, Alan Kimble was appointed as manager and remained in charge for the remainder of the season, however the side struggled and more changes in the playing staff occurred. Maldon finished the season in nineteenth place with only forty-nine points.

During the 2014-15 season, Media Officer at the time, Richard Buckby ran a competition for supporters to vote for a club nickname, with the options The River Boys, The Marshmen, The Mudmen & The Jammers available. The vote took place in January 2015 and was featured on National Radio station, TalkSport, with the The Jammers winning the vote with over 50% and being confirmed as the clubs new nickname.

Following the completion of the 2014-15 season, the club linked with Colchester United and the two clubs formed close ties, which resulted in ex Ipswich Town midfielder, David Wright being appointed as First Team Manager. Wright remained in charge until December 2015 as he was appointed Assistant Manager of Colchester United. Liam Bailey took charge of the First Team on a temporary basis, only managing one game, which finished four-all against Tilbury on Boxing Day in 2015. Moving into 2016, ex-Leiston Manager, Steve Ball was appointed First Team Manager and steered the club to a respectable finish in the league table climbing to seventh place, only missing out on the play-off places by nine points.

In the closed season, a change of Management at Colchester United saw Steve Ball appointed as their Assistant Manager, leaving his position of Maldon & Tiptree Manager as a result. Ex- Manchester City midfielder, Kevin Horlock was then appointed as First Team manager ahead of the 2016-17 campaign and for the majority of the season, the Jammers sat at the top of the table before slipping away to finish in second place. Horlock's side managed to reach the play-off final, however lost to Thurrock one-nil. The following campaign was not quite as successful for Horlock, with Maldon finishing just outside the play-off places in seventh place, with sixty-nine points.

After managing 112 games, Kevin Horlock departed in the closed season and was replaced by ex-Colchester defender, Wayne Brown. In Brown's first season in charge, the 2018-19 season, the Jammers finished in second place and reached the play-off final, but lost on penalties against local rivals, Heybridge Swifts.

The 2019–20 season was one to remember for the club, but for the right and wrong reasons. The club achieved great things in the Emirates FA Cup. Having reached the First Round proper of the competition, Maldon beat League Two side, Leyton Orient away from home, taking over 600 fans to the home of The O's, with the goals coming from Danny Parish and a superb solo goal from Jorome Slew. In the second round proper, Maldon were drawn against Football League side, Newport County with the game being shown live on National Television – with the Jammers only beaten by the League Two side, with a goal in stoppage time, with the game finishing 1–0. A record attendance of 1876 was recorded.





However, the 2019–20 season will also be remembered for the wrong reasons. After impressive performances on the field, the Jammers found themselves top of the Isthmian Division One North, thirteen points clear with four games in hand, when disaster struck. With a global pandemic declared, as a result of Coronavirus, the league competition was formally abandoned on 26 March 2020, with all results from the season being expunged, and no promotion or relegation taking place to, from, or within the division. The club were denied a chance of promotion and forced to remain in the Division One North for the 2020–21 season.

Following the disappointing end to the 2020-21 season, Wayne Brown remained in charge of the club and wholesale changes in the playing squad occurred again, with a number of last season's squad securing transfers to clubs higher up the football pyramid.

The Jammers were dealt a big blow in October 2020 when owner and Chairman, Ed Garty stood down from his position with immediate effect, after a challenging ten years at the helm. After a period of uncertainty for the football club, General Manager, Ron Dangerfield was confirmed as the new Chairman, with Richard Cowling taking ownership of the football club.

Just like the 2019-20 season, the 2020-21 season was terminated with promotion and relegation denied for all the sides competing in the Division One North. However, prior to the termination the Jammers reached the Emirates FA Cup First Round for the second successive season, this time losing to Morecambe 1-0 in front of the television cameras and achieved their longest ever run in the Buildbase FA Trophy, before losing to Gloucester City. The Jammers were only able to play the five league games, finishing in third place before the season was curtailed.

Heading in to the 2021/22 season, Wayne Brown remained in charge of the First Team and is now the clubs longest serving manager, holding the record for the most games managed in charge of Maldon & Tiptree Football Club.

Midway through the 2021/22 season, Brown was appointed as interim Head Coach at Colchester United, with Paul Abrahams taking over as interim Manager. Abrahams steered the Jammers within touching distance of the play-off semi-finals, however three defeats in the final three games saw the Jammers fall short, in 9th spot resulting in the Jammers remaining in the Isthmian Division One North for another season.

At the end of the season, Ron Dangerfield announced his departure as Chairman and left the club to join Charlton Athletic as Secretary. Jerry Carter replaced Dangerfield as Chairman, joining the club from Braintree Town. Roger Stapleton was immediately appointed as the club's vice-Chair.

In May 2022, Wayne Brown departed on a permanent basis and was appointed as Head Coach at Colchester United, having managed 141 games and a win percentage of 68% and arguably the club's most successful manager to date. After a positive spell as interim Manager, Paul Abrahams was appointed manager on 17 May 2022 following a five year term as Assistant Manager under various Managers.

Following a poor run of results in the league the club announced on 21st September 2022 the departure of Paul Abrahams with a new manager expected to be in place ahead of the game against Felixstowe & Walton United.

AS FA CUP draws go, there really is nothing like the fourth qualifying round.

Yes, the first round 'proper' (a word banned in NLP Towers), and third round draws will grab all the publicity but, for me, there isn't anything quite like the euphoria of the final qualifier before the 'big boys' come in.

Give the change of the Non-League landscape these last few years, I would argue that the Holy Grail for all FA Cup dreamers starts here – and this week's draw sure didn't disappoint.

Take Anstey Nomads for example. The lowest ranked club left in the competition as I write this, the Step 5 Nomads have progressed through five rounds to get to this stage for the first time in their history, culminating in a 5-0 victory over fellow minnows Shefford Town & Campton last weekend.

Their reward, a home tie with Chesterfield, second in the National League with average attendances of over 6,000 and FA Cup semi-finalists in 1996-97.

Who says the magic of the FA Cup only starts at round one?

And Nomads weren't the only ones to pick a dream tie in the live talkSPORT draw this week. Beckenham Town, riding high in Isthmian League South East having won promotion from Combined Counties South last week, were rewarded for their 5-3 success over Binfield with a visit of Dagenham & Redbridge to their modest Eden Park Avenue ground. What a scalp that could be?

Elsewhere, Coalville Town were handed a dream trip to Notts County's famous Meadow Lane stadium, steeped in FA Cup history, Sevenoaks Town were given a short trip to National League South leaders and Kent rivals Ebbsfleet United and St Ives Town were pulled out a home tie against top-flight strugglers FC Halifax Town, no doubt dreaming of adding their names to the cup archives.

Underdogs Hanley Town, Stocksbridge Park Steels or Ashington and Clitheroe or Bury AFC - in their first FA Cup foray as a phoenix club - were also looking to continue the journey as this column went to press with Tuesday night replays – arguably the biggest games in their club's history.

One tie which will stand out to the FA Cup purist, however, is Blyth Spartans' visit of National League Wrexham.

You have to go back to 1977-78 to stumble across the history between these two sides and a fifth-round replay played at Newcastle United.

After a H1 draw in the initial tie at Wrexham, the replay was switched to a snowbound St James's Park and was watched by an official attendance of 42,187 – easily the biggest crowd of the season there and one which wouldn't be bettered for 22 years!

Wrexham won the replay 2-1 and went on to lose 3-2 to Arsenal in the quarter-finals that season.

These days, of course, the Dragons are owned by A-lister Ryan Reynolds and Rob McElhenney and have dreams of replicating such glory.

But in order for the Hollywood storyline to roll into action, they're going to have to rewrite history and get past old foes Blyth first. Lights, camera, action!

Maldon & Tiptree's miserable season continued as they welcomed Great Wakering Rovers and were too welcoming by half, conceding three first half goals. Eusebio Da Silva, Perry Dunn and Alex Hernandez got the goals, Rovers up to fourteenth, the Jammers rock bottom without a point.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH: WALTER TULL


The first black footballer to play in English football, that we know of, did so in 1885, when Arthur Wharton took up a place between the sticks for Darlington. It shouldn't be much of a surprise, then, to find black players in the record throughout the history of the game. Thirty years later, when conflict broke out and football came to a halt, teams signed up together to go and fight in the trenches of France. And yet the story of Walter Tull, a footballer who become one of the county's first to sign up for military service, has gone largely unheralded in the century since he became a war hero.



Tull's life is a life of pioneering 'firsts'. He was born in Folkestone in 1888, three years after Arthur Wharton's debut, and was the grandson of a Barbadian slave, but when tragedy struck and both of his parents had died by the age of eleven, he was sent to an orphanage in London, before being adopted by a Glaswegian family and moving north of the border. In his new home, he excelled both in sports and academia, becoming the country's first dentist of mixed heritage before embarking on his footballing career.

Heading back to London in 1908, Tull signed with amateur side Clapton FC, at the time a much fancied team who were considered to be one of the best in the amateur game, at a time when the amateur game was held in high regard. Considered the "catch of the season", he helped the side to the FA Amateur Cup, the London County Amateur Cup, and the London Senior Cup, and caught the eye of Tottenham Hostpur. They offered to take him on trial, on their tour of South America, where he became the first mixed heritage player to play on the continent, and impressed sufficiently to join the team for the following season.

Despite early promise, the level of racial abuse he received from opposition fans was so vitriolic that he was dropped to the reserves after just a few games. He wouldn't return to the first team for over a year, and in total manged just ten games for the side before the player and the club decided to cut their losses, and he was moved on, this time to a Northampton Town side that was developing under Herbert Chapman. It would be the move that made his career, and over the next three seasons he made 110 appearances for the side, scoring nine goals. Preparing for his fourth season in the summer of 1914, nobody could have guessed what was about to come. War was declared on the 1st August, and



despite some attempts to get the season going, the conflict soon engulfed every aspect of life. Footballers were not immune.

Tull signed up for the army in December 1914, less than a week after, and completely separately from, a meeting in London led by players of Clapton Orient to encourage the creation of a footballers' battalion. He started his training in Cranleigh, and was moved to various training camps before being sent to France, as part of that battalion. Rising fast through the ranks, less than a year had passed before he had made the rank of Sergeant.

In May 1916 he was sent home suffering from shellshock, but was returned to France in order to take place in fierce fighting at Delville Wood and Guillemont during the Battle of the Somme. The grim conditions took their toll, however, and by January 1917 he was again returned to Britain, this time with Trench Fever. He made this time work for him, however, and joined a nearby Officer Training Corps. Despite huge opposition, he was promoted upon its completion to Second Lieutenant. He also secured his post-war future by agreeing a move to Rangers, upon the cessation of hostilities.

Sadly, Tull would never take up his position at lbrox. Returned to France, he became the first black officer to lead British soldiers into battle, at the Third Battle of Ypres, and was recommended for the Military Cross. As the war began to draw to a close, however, his luck ran out. He died at Arras in March 1918, 2nd Lt. Tull, and his body was never recovered. His name can be found on the Arras memorial in France, just one of 35,000 who died. But his life was not "just one of", it was "the first of", right to the end.
