



welcome back... GEORGE CLARKE

Seasiders forward George Clarke has spent over a year on the sidelines through injury, so it has been a welcome sight to see his name back on the teamsheet this month. We spoke to him about his recovery and long awaited return to the beautfiul game....

What was the injury that has kept you out for so long and how did it happen?

I've had three ankle surgeries since initially injuring it in a clash with a goalkeeper about six years ago, the latest being a complete reconstruction!

What has your treatment and recovery entailed?

After being on crutches and in a boot for a couple of months, the majority of my recovery was solely focused on getting my ankle strong again. Lots of band work, balance and stability stuff.

Have the club been supportive throughout the process?

The club have been great since the start and VERY patient!! They've supported me with regular physio sessions and made me feel valued throughout the process which does help massively mentally.

How are you feeling now? Do you consider yourself back to full fitness?

I feel pretty good currently, I still have to manage my training etc which has been fine so far but also frustrating as I can't always train with the boys. I'm still a long way off full fitness but give it another 4-6 weeks then hopefully I'll be there or there abouts.

How did it feel to be back on the pitch again?

It feels great, I didn't quite expect to be back starting a few games this early but it's been good and has helped me a lot. Hopefully I can stay injury free and have a good season

You scored your first goal of the season on Saturday against Hashtag Utd, talk us through it...

I felt massive relief when it hit the back of the net, It's been a long 15 months, so to get a goal in a big game like that means even more. It was great hustling by Woz to win the ball back, and I was there to bury it into the bottom corner!




Was this the first of many this season?

Not many people know this... It's all about the numbers!

en years ago today (29/10/2012) was a Monday, and we had lost 4-0 the previous Saturday (27th) at Ely City in a Thurlow Nunn League game in front of 57 spectators. But it was a critical time for the club... we had just appointed a new manager, Kevin O'Donnell, who proved to be the first of two major positive footballing influences on the club, transforming us from a middle of the road, mid table side, languishing in the lower reaches of the Thurlow Nunn League, to a competitive, forward-looking club.

Our average home gate that season after seven games was **94** and at the end of that campaign the average was **115**! Those first **seven** games total was **631**. **Last Saturday, there were 658 spectators here**.

Our new facilities obviously had a positive influence on the club, but the introduction of our current management set up of Stuart and Andy has taken the club to yet another level, introducing a professional approach born of experience with Ipswich Town for Andy and Ipswich Town & Torquay United for Stuart.



Our first seven games this season has attracted **2,472** spectators, at an average **351** per game, the side play entertaining football and we regularly feature in the national top ten table of attendances of all **Step 4** clubs.

Last Saturday, we were **5th** in the attendance table of **160 step 4** clubs over three leagues. Isthmian, Southern & Northern Premier.

THE OTHER SIDE GREAT MAKERING ROYERS



Photos from previous matches against Felixstowe 7 Walton FC



he club was formed in 1919 by soldiers demobbed after World War I and finding employment in the local brickfields. Not much in memory remains of the early years of the club although the club do pose some wonderful pictures from around that period.

We first played in one of Southend's oldest leagues, the Southend & District League, where



the Rovers stayed until 1982. Rovers were the leagues most dominant clubs, especially in the 1960s and 1970s and to this day remain so on record. The switch in 1982 saw the club move to the newly formed Southend & District Alliance Football League, but sadly this league folded in 1989 leaving Rovers with a decision to move back to the Southend & District League or take a step up in standard. With what most Rovers feel to be the best squad amassed by a manager, in this case Eddie Nash, Rovers took the decision to step up to intermediate level and joined the Essex Intermediate League.

Rovers remained in the Essex Intermediate League for three seasons, winning the championships of Divisions Three and Two in successive seasons. After the latter, Rovers successfully applied to join the Essex Senior League and found themselves in Step 5 of the Non-League pyramid, which for a village club was a tremendous feat.



In the 1994-1995 season Rovers narrowly beat Sawbridgeworth Town FC for the Essex Senior League title. Rovers had collected 71 points for the season and lost just three times although the title win was only won on goal difference (18). During that season Rovers forward Paul Flack scored 28 goals, which included a haul of 4 goals away at Eton Manor as Rovers celebrated a 9-0 victory. Also included in his stunning season were two further hattricks. That season his strike partner Neil Ramsey grabbed 20 goals as Rovers hit home 82 goals.

Rovers defence of the Essex Senior crown would falter the following season, finishing 2nd behind Romford. In the 1996–1997 season Rovers would also finish second again, behind Ford United by just three points. The 1997–1998 season would be Rovers worst season in the Essex Senior League, finishing mid-table, 7th, and 36 points behind winners Concord Rangers.

The club's final appearance in the Essex Senior League saw them finish 2nd behind Bowers United. However, due to Bowers United failing to meet ground grading requirements for promotion, Rovers were promoted to the Isthmian League in their place. With Isthmian League Division Three on the horizon for the 1999-2000 season, Rovers move into Step 4 of the league pyramid was complete.

At the very first attempt Rovers were promoted to Division Two finishing behind East Thurrock Utd by three points. Promotion to Division Two gave Rovers some stiffer opposition and the season finished with Rovers in mid-table.

In 2002 the Isthmian League then reorganised and Rovers found themselves in a new look Division One North, finishing mid-table but more than holding their own in what was a very competitive league. In 2003 the club were embroiled in a relegation fight, although this was won convincingly as Rovers finished 15 points ahead of the relegation zone. A further league reorganisation in 2004 saw the club switch to the Southern Football League Eastern Division for two seasons.

The 2004-2005 season saw Rovers miss relegation by one point due to Erith & Belvedere FC being deducted three points, but in the 2005-2006 season Rovers bounced back to finish safely in mid-table.

For the 2006–2007 season Rovers found themselves in familiar territory, switching back to the Isthmian League Division One North, where we finished 12th. Two further seasons saw Rovers finish 13th and stabilise themselves as a Ryman League club.

The 2009-2010 season brought a record number of points for the Rovers at Ryman League level, 64, but towards the end of the season manager lain O'Connell was offered the management of Ryman Premier League side Margate leaving assistant Ryan Wilkinson and physio Cleve Taylor to take over temporary





control with 12 games to go. In a season that saw Rovers top the table for 9 weeks, the dizzy heights would eventually get to O'Connell's side as they finished in 9th place, 13 points behind the playoffs.

Ryan Wilkinson and Cleve Taylor would be implemented as joint-managers for the 2010-2011 season and their first season in charge would offer up 44 points and 15th place in the league. Their start to the 2011-2012 season wasn't what they had hoped and after one win in their opening nine games, both offered their resignations. Rovers made first team coach Danny Heath caretaker manager and he brought temporary stabilisation back to the side as they recorded two wins and three draws from his seven games in charge.

Rovers would offer the management post to Danny Greaves, son of ex-Tottenham and England legend Jimmy Greaves. Danny saw that a clean sweep of the side was required and let go the majority of the squad, bringing in loanees whilst trying to sign up new players. unfortunately, this plan didn't work and after a miserable run of six losses in a row, he too offered his resignation.

Rovers would offer ex-Captain and stalwart Dan Trenkel the position as manager in November 2011 in an effort to stabilise the club. However, Trenkel was playing for Redbridge FC at the time who were on a fantastic run in the FA Cup, and it would be two weeks before he would be unveiled at the club, Danny Heath taking temporary control again, although this time losing both games.

Trenkel would bring back a number of players previously released by Danny Greaves, and opened his management career with a 2-2 draw at home to Waltham Forest, followed by a 1-1 draw at home to Harlow Town. However, although the side were performing better, results would continue to go against him and after just three wins in the remaining 21 games, including 6 draws, Rovers would find themselves bottom of the table and staring relegation into the Essex Senior League.

In 2014, they won the ESL by one point on the final day of the season, and were promoted back to the Isthmian League.

2016/17 season was probably the most turbulent the club has ever experienced. Seeing two Chairman leaving their posts, together with two Managers also losing their jobs. In total 71 players were used in the fight against relegation without any success. As we were finally relegated after two seasons at step 4 in the FA Pyramid returning to the Essex Senior League.

Manager Iain O'Connell, in his second spell with the club has been working hard during the summer to put together a strong squad and to lay down the foundation to mount a



serious challenge for promotion to enable Great Wakering Rovers to get back to Step 4 in the FA pyramid the club expects.

2017/18 Season Rovers won the ESL again as well as the Errington League Cup and was promoted back to the Isthmian League once again.

2018/19 see's Garry Kimble take over from lain O'Connell, who stepped down as Rovers manager during pre-season to concentrate on his family.

Rovers had a up and down season with Gary Kimble leaving the club and Stephen Butterworth taking over just after Christmas on a temporary basis and managed to keep Rovers up and playing Isthmian football again for 2019-20 season.

Stephen Butterworth was given the role on a permanent basis going into 2019/20 season finishing their highest position in the club's history just outside the playoff place in 7th with 43 points.

2020/21 season was the season that wasn't, with Rovers only managing 7 league games and claiming only 8 points.

2021/22 season see's Rovers bring in Glenn Robson as interim manager following Stephen Butterworth's departure, John Coventry Snr. was then appointed manager on a permanent



basis along with John Coventry Jnr. as coach. After a string of poor results leaving the club in a precarious position, John Coventry Snr. and Jnr. were replaced until the end of the season

by former manager lain O'Connell with Martin Tuohy as player/coach, lain returning to the club trying to help retain our league status. Having achieved that by getting 8 points from the final 4 games lain has agreed to take the role on a permanent basis for the 2022/23 season but Martin Tuohy has decided to retire from football to spend more time with his young family, we wish Martin all the best in his retirement.



YOU NEVER forget your first time! Wembley had that same impact on me as it has, and does, for many others.

Mine was an FA Vase final between Guisley and Gresley Rovers in 1991. My main memories are being slightly late and running up the steps inside as the national anthems were playing! Mainly it was seeing that famous patch of grass – and how green it looked. It wasn't an ordinary pitch. There was something about it. The goals were different too, the famous tunnel way behind the goal all capturing my imagination.

Of course, the game probably helped. A 4-4 thriller between the two sides – in those days the final went to a replay – but the six-year-old me was hooked in.

Over the years I was lucky enough to see many more FA Vase finals at the famous ground. Diss Town winning in 1994, Tiverton Town's back-to-back success a few years later. Since working at the paper I've only missed one – Newport Pagnell Town's most recent win with a decent excuse of having a five-day old baby.

From the Northern League domination and the evolution to the fixture becoming part of Non-League Finals Day, the only real low point was watching Hebburn and Consett play their game out in front of an empty stadium because of Covid.

It was right, however, the players got their chance to play on that pristine surface.

For me, the FA Vase is a hidden gem in out footballing calendar. At the moment it's early days, but as the rounds tick on over the coming weeks and months, the dreams and aspiration will begin to grow.

There's a rawness about the competition. In the latter stages teams from the other end of the country are drawn against each other – modern technology means scouting has become easier and there are always contacts for managers to draw on for information.



But quite often it is football in its purest form, two teams who know very little about each other trying to win a game of football on a given day and aiming to take another step on the road to Wembley.

The FA deserve credit for how Non-League Day already has that feel of an important date in the annual fixture list.

Attendances have been huge over the years – some big teams have made it there of course – and the next challenge will be to increase the neutral support on the day.

So why not this year? The FA Vase final is usually an action-packed spectacle. Even if you're side aren't in the competition, try and get along. Especially if you haven't been before.

PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NORTH ROUND UP

Felixstowe go second, Swifts hit five, Rocks win again - and Brentwood deliver the comeback of the day

Lowestoft Town remained unbeaten at start of play but saw their one hundred percent record come to an end at Hullbridge Sports last weekend. They'd perhaps the toughest possible opponents as they looked to get back to winning ways, as their nearest challengers Grays Athletic came to call - and it was the visitors who broke the deadlock six minutes after the break, Sam Bantick's eighth of the

season giving them the lead. That awoke the hosts, who roared back to take the lead, Adam Hipperson with the equaliser and Charlie Norman with the second, and the visitors then went down to ten men as Joshua Osude saw red. Shortly afterwards Rhys Logan made it three-one, and that turned out to be that - the Trawler Boys ending the day with an eight point lead at the top.

Heybridge Swifts lost their first league game last weekend, but quickly bounced back to defeat Witham Town in midweek and were quickly ahead against Tilbury, Kieran Jones getting his fourth of the season in only the second minute. By the eighteenth minute it was three-nil, Darren Phillips and Rhys Henry adding to the tally, and Phillips made it four from the spot on twenty five minutes as the Dockers dithered. On thirty six minutes it was five-nil, Rob Harvey adding his name to the scoresheet, but after that the hosts slackened their pace and the last goal of the game came right at the end. It was a Dockers consolation through Darnell Kithambo, although it's doubtful they'll take any consolation from it. Swifts go third.

Stowmarket Town have been in superb form, up to fourth as we kicked off and with only one defeat this season. Nine games without defeat in all competitions, they welcomed a Great Wakering Rovers side who were soon behind, Reggie Lambe opening the scoring in

the thirteenth minute. Rovers didn't give up and drew level from the spot with twenty minutes left, Alex Hernandez keeping his nerve, but that just spurred on the hosts, and Kane Munday looked to have given them the points with a goal in the last minute. Celebrations were premature, however, as Kewin Kwiek immediately drew the visitors level - and that was that. Town drop to sixth.

We started the day with only one point between third and eighth, and Brentwood Town were hoping to overturn that deficit as they entertained Witham Town. They got off to a terrible start, Abdul Rasheed scoring for the visitors in the very first minute, but levelled through Andy Freeman just before the half hour - something that obviously angered Rasheed as he added two more almost immediately to claim a hat trick and put his side three-one up. Just before the break Charlie Kendall made it two-three and the equaliser arrived midway through the second half, George Craddock making it three-three. The comeback was complete with thirteen minutes left, Freeman getting his second of the match for four-three, and it was five-three six minutes later, Marlon Agyakwa with the fifth as the visitors wondered how they'd lost. Rasheed deserves the match ball - but will he want it?

AFC Sudbury added Aveley goalkeeper David Hughes to their squad prior to their trip to **Basildon United**, but the Bees were also busy in the transfer market this week. The Yellows entered the match unbeaten and, although they started the day in sixth place, have three games in hand to make up the nine point gap between themselves and the leaders. Josh Stokes opened the scoring for the visitors seven minutes before the break, but shortly after the restart the Bees stung, Kye Jude with the equaliser - and the hosts then went ahead, Wilson Chingoka with their second. You ignore Nnamdi Nwachuku at your peril, and the Sudbury striker got his sixteenth of the campaign to level with nine

minutes remaining, but both sides had to settle for a point.

Bury Town, in ninth, knew they could climb as high as third with victory over Hullbridge Sports - but they were soon behind, Darius Ghinea opening the scoring on the quarter hour with a goal from a free kick. The Ram Meadow faithful had seen their side lose two of their last three, but they were given something to cheer when Cemal Ramadan drew them level just before the break - and cheered even louder a minute later when Ramadan's thirteenth of the season made it two-one. Sports weren't finished, however, and they took a point when Emmanuel Folarin levelled two minutes from time.

East Thurrock United had gone five league matches without defeat and seemed to have found their North Division mojo as they welcomed Gorleston, and so it proved as they were two up inside eighteen minutes, Ben Steward with both of them. That's six matches unbeaten now for the Rocks, and up to tenth.

New Salamis welcomed Wroxham to Coles Park. The hosts were four games without a win in League, Velocity Cup and Trophy, and were ahead in this one on fourteen minutes, Derek Asamoah striking for the eighth time this season - but the Yachtsmen were quickly level and soon ahead, Brad Spooner and Shaun Taylor turning things around. The hosts then hit back to equalise through George Lutaaya, and midway through the second half Asamoah put them ahead - but again the Yachtsmen struck back, Ryan Miles equalising - his ninth of the season. That was the end of the goals, Salamis in twelfth, Wroxham in seventeenth.

Coggeshall Town and **Maldon & Tiptree** are both desperate for points, but they had to settle for one each - and no goals.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH: THE ORANGE FREE STATE FOOTBALL TEAM



ootball is the biggest sport in the world, and is played across the globe, enjoyed by billions. This spread, in large part, is due to the influence of European empires, and in particular the British Empire, as it sought to exert its control over a third of the planet. But in many colonies, including African colonies, it's earliest inception was intended

as a whites-only game, usually played between colonisers rather than indigenous peoples. For the native populations, they often had to adopt the game outside of the organisational structures. Nowhere was that truer than in South Africa, where Cecil Rhodes presided over the all-white South African Football Association. Interesting, then, in 1899,



the footballing authorities in that country took the decision to send an all black team to Europe. Just a few months before the start of the Second Boer War, the Orange Free State Football Team docked in Southampton.

Football in South Africa grew slowly and erratically, moving from a jumpers for goalposts style amateurism, through a comical and trivial form of entertainment before eventually ending at the kind of organised competition we understand in the late 1880s. By 1897, funded by diamond magnate Cecil Rhodes, Corinthians made their way to the country with the kind of punishing schedule that would make Jurgen Klopp faint; two months, 23 games, and a major boost for the popularity of football in the colony. Two years later, it was time to return the favour.

The British press welcomed the team, led by Joseph Twayi, with open arms, even if the welcome was tinged with racist undertones. The touring team was said to be fast, powerful and athletic, although the Manchester Times did admit their own ignorance over the specifics of the squad and its quality, while the Scottish Sport acknowledged that the players had only been playing for a few years, and lacked the tradition of the game already claimed at home. By contrast, the South African press was appalled. 'The whole affair is farcical as it is unsportsmanlike,' reported the Cape Argus, suggesting that "every white man south of the Zambezi... will regret the whole proceedings" of a team of black players appearing to represent their nation. But the tour would not be stopped.

Sadly, this was to be no David versus Goliath tale, and the visiting side, quite apart from being exotic curiosities, were no real match for the more storied clubs they were up against. Thousands of people turned out to see them, but it was reported that their interest turned to amusement and laughter at the Orange Free State side's ineptitude. They lost 5-3 to Sunderland, 7-3 to Middlesbrough and 9-3 to Scarborough as

the local press turned on them, referring to them as 'alleged footballers'. The tour continued north into Scotland, where six more games were lost heavily, in front of large crowds. The Scottish Sport reported that 'to treat the game between the Kaffirs and Hibs seriously would be one door off sacrilege' and suggested that they visitors combine with the 'lady footballers' who had similarly struggled to gain recognition for their sport in the nineteenth century.

The inability of the Orange Free State team to compete provoked outrage at home, and local newspapers started receiving letters from angered white people in South Africa. One declared that the idea of black players playing against white players would never be considered there, and that the side in no way represented football in the country. Another, who wrote to the Sporting Times, actually used the phrase 'equality is revolting' while explaining that a black person is 'not a human being'.

The criticism forced a response from the team, and Twayi told his story in the press. Having been prevented from partaking in the game as a younger man, he learned to play by watching others on dirt, when time away from his grocery would allow it. This was the story of most of the squad, amateurs doing their best, not even used to playing on grass, suddenly thrust into the spotlight in unfamiliar surroundings, with thousands of opposition fans in attendance, on a surface most of them had never set foot on. The desire to play in the country came from their extreme loyalty to it, and when the Boer War broke out they were still in England, and came out on the side of the British. Regardless of the results, their tour broke new ground both for non-white football in this country, and for football in the colonies. If nothing else, that's something to celebrate.
