Sadly, one of the major downsides of writing a column in a club programme such as this is having the job of writing bad or sad news, and as it's recently been writing obituaries on an almost weekly basis...

Albert (Bertie) Grainger 1934-2023

Today has seen the funeral of Bertie Grainger, at the age of 88. Many of the players who were part of the Seasiders set up in the late 60's, early 70's will have warm memories of Bertie who moved up from London in the late 60's working for BT and settled in Felixstowe.

The Grainger family recently announced the sad passing of Bertie, aged 88.

Not many of you will know of Bertie - or those of you that do, the memories will be distant. He was signed to play for the Seasiders for the 1968/69 season by our (now) club President who at the time was the Seasiders manager, Dave Ashford.

At the time Bertie was 36 years old and went on to play another full season before retiring. Having played at a professional level, he was a standout player with Felixstowe Town F.C. who were at that time in the Essex & Suffolk Border league.

Bertie enjoyed a spell at Millwall reserves, but his favourite time as a footballer was during his National Service days, when he was picked to play for the Combined Services Representative team.

During his time as player with the CSR he often played with or against the international players of the day, but his proudest moment & the one that gave him most pleasure came when he was invited to play for the Football Association representative side.

During the late fifties & early sixties Bertie played for Tooting & Mitcham F.C. who competed in a very strong Isthmian League.

In 1959 they reached the 3rd round of the FA Cup and played Nottingham Forest at home, the game was drawn 2-2.

In the Tooting side that day was Albert Grainger, who scored the opening goal.

The visitors fought back with a cool finish from Sonny Coughlin-Brown on 13 minutes after a loose pass was intercepted before **Harrison** poked in his second goal on 19 minutes at the far post to restore the cushion. Hertford reduced the arrears once again just before half time with a Brian Garzon penalty following a handball. Felixstowe continued to look dangerous despite the away side having more of the ball second half and **Jack Ainsley** punished the away defence on 70 minutes with a back post volley. Garzon again pulled Hertford a single goal behind with his second penalty of the game on 80 minutes for another handball but Felixstowe finally stretched the lead out to win the game with **Henry Barley** (87) scoring from the right angle and **Josh Mayhew** (90+2) slotting home a near post effort for his first goal for the Seasiders.

Felixstowe started brightly and created some half chances early on, Lamell Howell with an overhead kick that was saved, Josh Hitter with a header that flashed over the bar and Henry Barley with a sweet left foot strike that was

just wide of the far post. Lakenheath grew into the game and although they created little they had a good share of possession. Henry Barley caught the eye with several mazy runs and looked the most likely to create scoring opportunities. There were no goals in the first half and Lakenheath were probably happier than Felixstowe with the scoreline. The second half started with Felixstowe forcing a corner in the first minute, the ball was half cleared then returned into the penalty area and **Josh Mayhew** calmly sidefooted the ball in from 8 yards to open the scoring, his second goal in two games. The lead was short lived and following a fierce shot from a 25 yard free kick the ball became loose and was knocked in by Lakenheath from short range. **Charlie Warren** came on for Callum Harrison, who was feeling

unwell and it didn't take him long to affect the game, scoring with a left foot drive into the corner of the net giving the keeper no chance. This was followed by man of the match, Henry Barley, cutting in from the right and rifling a left foot drive into the bottom corner to make it 3-1. The last goal was the best of the game a mazy run starting outside the box by Charlie Warren took him ten yards from the goal, going past three defenders before slotting the ball into the bottom corner to make the final score 4-1 and inflicting the first defeat of the season for Lakenheath. THE OTHER SIDE BRIGHTLINGSEA REGENT EC



Brightlingsea Regent, previously Brightlingsea United, have completed around 100 years of competitive football. Firstly, in the Border league, between 1908/1909 to 1970 when they joined The Essex Senior league for 20 years having much success, before going on to join the then Jewson League in 1990 and then back to the Border league in 2001/2002. Brightlingsea United FC and Regent Park Rangers FC amalgamated at the start of 2005/2006 season to become Brightlingsea Regent Football Club. During this time, the squad and club have continued to grow and develop, having success in the Border league Division 1 and cup.

In 2009/2010 new Management team James Webster and Mark Gridley guided Regent to a 4th place finish and followed up the following season in 2010/2011 by winning the Kent Blaxill Essex and Suffolk Border Premier League in a superb season by playing 34, winning 31, drawing 2 and losing just 1 game.

In season 2011/2012, James Webster added Tom Rothery to the Management team in September and they finished their first season back at Step 6 with a creditable 5th place finish. They also reached the quarter-finals of the Essex Senior Cup before losing to League 2 side Dagenham & Redbridge. The 2012/2013 season was successful for many reasons. Firstly, an FA Vase cup run, which was the longest in the clubs history before bowing out in round 3 (last 64). The club gained promotion back to step 5 and the Premier Division with a third-place finish which included a 22-game unbeaten run during the season. In the final game of the season the team won the First Division KO Cup final with a 1-0 victory over Gt Yarmouth.

The 2013/2014 season in the Eastern Counties Premier Division again proved to be successful for Brightlingsea, gaining promotion after finishing Runners-up to Hadleigh Utd, losing out on the final day by goal difference. The club also reached the last 16 of the FA Vase and in doing so again created more history.

The 2016/2017 season saw Brightlingsea Regent crowned as champions of the Isthmian North Division, notching up an impressive 103 points and finishing 12 points ahead of their closest rivals, ensuring an historic promotion to the Isthmian Premier League.

In October 2017 long-standing manager James Webster left the club to be replaced by former assistant manager and coach Tom Rothery, assisted by Pip Boyland, who maintained the R's Isthmian Premier league standing and won the Essex FA's Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup.

2018/2019 saw the Regent achieve their highest ever finish in the non-league pyramid, along with their best ever FA Cup and FA Trophy runs. They also retained the Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup with a 1-0 victory at Maldon & Tiptree.

After Tom Rothery stepped down from the manager's position in September 2019, Colchester United legend Kem Izzet took the hot seat and avoided relegation in his first season in charge, In a season that was cut short in February due to Covid-19. 2020/2021 A later than usual start to the season saw Regent make an early management change as Kem Izzet departed the club in October, replaced with the management duo of Tom Austin and Ryan Salter, arriving from



FC Clacton. The season was then curtailed in December and no more football was played.

2021/2022 Tom Austin and Ryan Salter resigned from their positions at the Beginning of November with the club positioned within the relegation places. The R's appointed Brett Munyard and his team of Mark Healy, Ricky Stubbs and Dave Limber who dramatically saved the club from relegation on the penultimate game of the season with a 3-0 victory over Haringey Borough to secure Step 3 football for the 6th season.

2022/2023 Brightlingsea Regent suffered their first relegation under the Regent name, finishing bottom of the Isthmian Premier Division following a 6-year spell. We now return to the Isthmian North Division for the 2023/2024 season.

Outside the impressive spectacle that is the Camp Nou there is a statue. It is dedicated to the player chosen, in 1999, as Barcelona's greatest of the twentieth century. In full flight, with the ball at his feet, he looks ready to take a shot, one more that would no doubt nestle into the corner of the net. Obvious candidates leap out of the history books for this accolade. Diego Maradona, Johann Cruyff, Romario, Ronaldo. Some of the greatest players of all time, playing some of the most exciting football the world has ever seen. So it is something of a surprise, then, that the player voted Barca's greatest, is Laszlo Kubala.

Kubala was one of a golden generation of players. Under different circumstances, he probably would have formed part of the Magical Magyars side that, statistically, is the greatest of all time. But the postwar politics of Eastern Europe were complicated. Kubala started his career at Ferencvaros, playing alongside the legendary Sandor Kocsis, but did not agree to the military service that was required of all Hungarian men. He fled to Czechoslovakia, then back to Hungary, before the Soviet Union occupied his country and he made a permanent exit. Agreeing a plan with his wife, he joined a group of refugees headed for Austria, and then made for Italy. Anna would swim across the Danube, with their infant son in tow, and join him later.

In Italy, Kubala initially joined Serie A side Pro Patria, playing a handful of games but impressing fans with his trickery. Becoming a bit of a celebrity, he was invited to join the great Grande Torino side for a testimonial in Portugal. As he prepared to leave, however, Anna arrived, exhausted from her own escape,



and Kubala turned down the invitation. The decision saved his life; on the return flight, Torino's plane crashed into the Basilica di Superga. Everyone on board died.

The other side of Kubala's fame was that the Hungarian authorities finally discovered where he was. They demanded FIFA punish him, and FIFA obliged by banning him for a year. This allowed first Real Madrid, and then Barcelona to come calling for his signature. How he ended up at the Blaugrana is disputed, but the most plausible story is that, when Kubala demanded that they also hire his boyhood coach, fellow refugee, and father in law Ferdinand Daucik as manager, Real Madrid refused, while their great rivals accepted his terms.

His ban ran through most of the 1950-51 season, and when it finally came to an end the league was already over. The cup remained, however, and Kubala got to work. In seven games, he scored six goals, and helped bring a trophy to Les Corts, Barcelona's ground at the time. It was a telling introduction.

In his first full season as a Barcelona player, Kubala played 19 games, and scored 26 goals. The Catalan side romped to the league title, but in a show of exceptional dominance also brought all three domestic cups home with them. The cherry on top was winning the Latin Cup, the forerunner to the European Cup. Five trophies, the Hungarian influence was undeniable.

Kubala missed most of the following season with tuberculosis, but was able to return in time for another league and cup double. Daucik was nomadic by nature, and with his impressive CV moved on to Athletic Club, where he won the cup twice, and then a number of other Spanish clubs over the next two decades. But Kubala stayed, and continued building his legend.

More than goals and trophies, Kubala ignited a footballing passion in the people of his adopted city. Thousands of extra fans started turning out to watch Kuksi in action, and he didn't disappoint. Not just goals, but



excitement was what he brought to the pitch. He was quick, agile, strong and tricky. Against Botafogo, with his shirt ripped from his body, he scored bare-chested. Helenio Herrera claimed Kubala was the first player to ever curl a free kick over a wall. Unsurprisingly, Les Corts was too small to hold all of his adoring fans. In 1957, Barcelona had to move to the Camp Nou to accommodate them.

Despite Herrera's admiration, the two did not get on when the Argentine arrived at Barcelona in 1958. He brought Sandor Kocsis, a more recent refugee, with him, and tried to impose a strict discipline. For the partying, drinking, womanising Kubala, this would not work. He was dropped to the bench, and the trophies dried up. Herrera was sacked in 1960. Kubala took his job.

The Hungarian turned out to not be as successful in the dugout as he was on the pitch, but that probably had much to do with his love of playing. He turned out sporadically for sides for another seven years, until he was forty, flipping between management and playing. But it didn't matter in Barcelona, where he was already a legend. Of all the greats to have graced the Camp Nou, he may be the greatest.

Enjoy the game.

From that time Billericay took over the game, Tom Bullard and Joe Whight were defending admirably and dealing well with numerous crosses that were coming into the box. Billericay scored their second goal in the 57th minute with a low drive from the edge of the box. It was all one way traffic now with Felixstowe defending for their lives. With a quarter of an hour to go a fierce strike from outside the box struck a defenders arm and the referee gave a harsh penalty as there was no arm movement towards the ball and the defenders arm was down by his side. They scored from the penalty with an unstoppable shot high into the roof of the net making it 3-3. For the rest of the game Billericay camped in the Felixstowe half of the pitch, Felixstowe held firm until the 88th minute when a cross from the

FORGIVE the self-indulgence, but some of my best memories of this job will be covering the FA Cup — more specifically, the FA Cup shocks.

For every long trip to Huddersfield Town — where they stuck two past Dover Athletic inside the opening eight minutes before playing out a 2-0 win — there's been an enjoyable drive back from Burnley or Torquay.

Lincoln City's run of 2016-17 stands out the most, largely because I was fortunate enough to be there for most of the ride.

Ipswich Town away in early January brought a 2-2 draw for the Imps but who could predict what would come with a journey that catapulted the club and its then managers — Danny and assistant Nicky Cowley — into another stratosphere.

Ipswich were finished off in the third round replay — I watched on TV — before Brighton & Hove Albion were turned over in the fourth round.

Out of the hat came Burnley where Sean Raggett's late goal won an incredible tie. Sitting in the press room after I felt I had to check over and over again that Lincoln City had reached the quarter-finals before writing into the match report.

Before we knew it, we were at Danny Cowley's house with the FA Cup for a special pre-Arsenal feature.

The Premier League Gunners were next but Arsene Wenger's side were in no mood to be part of any more history, seeing off the Imps 5-0 — not that the 10,000 travelling supporters ever lost their voice. When Crawley Town went to Manchester United in 2011 it was a much closer encounter, striker Richard Brodie just inches away from a late equaliser only for the woodwork to intervene.

My in-person north-west record is pretty good. Macclesfield seeing off Cardiff City with two goals from Matthew Barnes-Homer.

Then I was there when Salford City beat Notts County 2-0 on a Friday night in November 2015. The next day legendary FA Cup giant killers Altrincham dumped out League One Barnsley 1-0, immediately justifying The NLP's hotel bill for my overnight stay!

But it hasn't just been the upsets or the near-misses. A privilege of the job is being able to tell the stories in the build-up or be at a club when it's all eyes on them. Paulton Rovers may have been turned over by Norwich City, but the buzz around the club through the week was heightened even more on match day as FA Cup fever swept through the small village.

We're inching closer to this season's FA Cup first round proper with the fourth round qualifying games just around the corner.

The exciting thing about the FA Cup is this year's stories are just waiting to be written. Experiencing them in person is definitely a job perk!
