From this point on, in all honesty, we struggled to get any real rhythm in our play, and even with Bowers being reduced to 10 men, we couldn't match the standards of the first half.

We managed to get ourselves back on level terms as a great cross-field ball picked out Joe who got behind their back 4 to put in a perfect cross to be met by the incoming Billy. Game on!

For all our endeavors, we never really caused Bowers too many problems, although we started to look more dangerous for some reason when we had Billy dismissed for a second yellow. For me, both were questionable. From here, the game opened up, and Bowers went ahead in the 90th minute with a top-draw, very cool finish. A goal worthy of winning any game, although in this instance, definitely not deserved. This defeat means we have managed to earn 7 points from the last 21 available, yet we still sit second in the table, only 6 points behind leaders Lowestoft. Although in reality, not what one would consider to be promotion form, for me, it highlights just how well the side has done up until this point of the season.

As I said to a number of people on Saturday (and we do love a cliché), "form is temporary, but class is permanent." I firmly believe in Boards and the boys, and that with a settled, injury-free group back to somewhere near their confident best, we will again be scoring goals for fun and gaining those all-important points towards promotion or the playoffs.

Now, playing football at Step 5 or higher between us and Stow' or within sensible travelling distance there are Lowestoft Town & Bury Town who were already playing at a higher level, Woodbridge Town, Brantham Athletic, Ipswich Wanderers, Whitton United, Needham Market, Leiston FC & Sudbury Town.



Felixstowe earned a free kick, central outside the box in the second minute, Harrison shot was blocked by the wall. Bowers tactics were very clear, get the ball forward as soon as possible with long goalkeeper kicks deep into our half

and long throw ins at every opportunity and they were bypassing their midfield. After 10 minutes Barley cut in from the left and a fierce drive was pushed round the post at full stretch from Hughes in the Bowers goal. From the resultant corner a close effort from Bullard hit the post and was cleared. In the 22nd minute a great through ball from Holland released Ford through the middle, he lobbed the ball over the onrushing keeper only to see his effort just drift wide of the post. The game became more evenly balanced as the half went on, but in the 41st minute TQ Addy reacted badly to a foul by Holland and got himself sent off for retaliation, Holland received a caution.

Felixstowe brought on Joe Whight for Stuart Ainsley at left back for the second half. The second half started with a bang, hesitation in the Felixstowe defence was punished by the ever alert Price who scored easily in the 46th minute. Felixstowe then upped their game, Whight made two great runs down the left flashing two dangerous low crosses into the penalty area, the first one was sliced by a defender going for a corner, close to an own goal. The second cross was met by Holland who equalised from 8 yards. At this stage against ten men it looked likely that

However things changed when Holland miscontrolled a pass near the half way line, trying to retrieve the ball he caught a Bowers player late and received his second yellow levelling the sides up 10v10. Felixstowe brought on Mayhew And Hitter, increasing their attacking options, Jack Ainsley and Warren had a couple of half chances as their drives just went past the keepers right hand post. It was Bowers who won the match in the 92nd minute, Williamson made a strong run from left to right just outside the penalty area before shooting right foot with a low drive that found the bottom corner of the net as nobody closed him down. To sum up the match, Felixstowe played the better football and had they taken their early chances we may have seen a different result, Bowers play to their strengths and are good at putting pressure on opponents defences. THE OTHER SIDE STOW/MARKET TOW/N FC

The club was founded as Stowmarket Association FC in 1883 by a merger of Stowmarket St Peter and Stowmarket Ironworks. Originally playing at the Cricket Meadow, their first match was against Needham Market School. The club were founder members of the Suffolk County Football Association in 1885. By the late 1800s the club had dropped the word "Association" from its name, which had originally been used to distinguish it from the local rugby club.

They joined the newly formed Ipswich & District League in 1896, and won the title in its first two seasons and again in 1899–1900. In 1907 they won the Suffolk Junior Cup, beating Westbourne Mills 5–1, and in 1909–10 the club won the league again, with the reserve team winning the second division. They won the title again in 1921–22, before transferring to the Essex & Suffolk Border League in 1925. In 1931 the club won the Suffolk Senior Cup for the first time, beating Sudbury Town 3–1. They won it for a second time in 1933, beating Kirkley 5–2, and again the following season, with a 3–0 win over Bury Town.

At the end of the 1936-37 season the club disbanded due financial difficulties. After World War II local club Stowupland Corinthians began playing at the Cricket Meadows, and joined the Border League in 1946. In the summer of 1947 the club's name was changed to Stowmarket Corinthians, and in August it was changed again to Stowmarket Town. After legal advice, it was changed again to Stowmarket FC.

Under the management of player-coach Jackie Little, The club won the Border League, the League Cup and the Suffolk Senior Cup in 1950-51, beating Sudbury Town 2-0 in front of 10,867 supporters in the final of the latter. The League Cup and the Senior Cup were won again in 1951-52, and at the end of the season

the club joined the Eastern Counties League.

In 1957-58 they won the Senior Cup again, beating Newmarket Town 2-0. They won the trophy for a sixth time in 1961-62, beating Brantham Athletic 2-0. The following year they entered the Suffolk Premier Cup and won it, beating Lowestoft Town 3-0. A seventh success in the Senior Cup was achieved in 1965 with a 4-0 win over Orwell Works, and the Premier Cup was won again in 1977 with a 2-1 win over Sudbury Town after the original two-legged tie had ended level.

In 1983 they were renamed Stowmarket Town, and a year later moved to Greens Meadow. The club won the Premier Cup again in 1986, beating Lowestoft 1-0, and in 1991, when Haverhill Rovers were beaten 3-2 after extra time. At the end of the 2004-05 season the club were relegated for the first time in their history, dropping into Division One, where they have remained since.

After a hiatus of over forty years, the club won the Senior Cup again in 2006–07, beating Grundisburgh 2–1. In 2016–17 season they were Division One champions and were promoted back to the Premier Division. In 2019–20 the club were unbeaten 28 games into the league season, but the league was abandoned due to the coronavirus pandemic.

At the end of the 2020-21 season, which was also curtailed due to the pandemic, they were promoted to the North Division of the Isthmian League.

It was three just after the half hour, Adam Hipperson with that one, and Jake Reed's twentieth of the season was their fourth. ten minutes after the restart. Hipperson scored again, making it five-nil on the hour, and right at the end the visitors made it six or rather the hosts scored a sixth for them. The Trawler Boys are once more six points clear.

PITCHING

Basildon United, who climbed to fifth after their midweek win over New Salamis, were on top form from the off against third place Brightlingsea Regent in this clash of the promotion hopefuls, and went ahead after just three minutes, Callum Fitzer with the goal. It took until ten minutes from time for the next goal to arrive, and again it went to the hosts, Brad Warner making it two-nil. Regent got a goal back just before the end, Derek Asamoah giving them hope, but there was no time to build on that. The Bees are up to fourth, Regent slip to sixth.

Ipswich Wanderers played host to promotion hopefuls **Brentwood Town,** and Wanderers,

who had lost their previous five, were quickly ahead - Matt 'Steak Bake' Blake, a former golden boot winner, opening the scoring on eight minutes. Town struck back almost immediately, Samuel 'Cheese and Onion Pasty' (we might have made that one up) Jeremiah levelling just four minutes later. Five minutes before the break the visiting Blues went two-one up through Andy Freeman, and just before the break it was three-one, Matt Cripps giving Town a cushion. After the break the Blues went goal crazy, Freeman adding a fourth, Shad Ngandu getting a fifth, and Daniel Ogunleye making it six eleven minutes from time - a result which lifts them back into the top five.

Gorleston welcomed **Heybridge Swifts**, and ninety minutes brought some entertainment

but no goals. Swifts slip to seventh, the Greens are thirteenth.

Maldon & Tiptree hoped to bounce back from their derby day defeat against Heybridge Swifts as Walthamstow came to call, and the Jammers were ahead eleven minutes before the break, Louis Britton taking his tally for the season to twelve. Harry Phillips doubled the lead just before the hour mark, and two minutes later added a third, before Britton made it four with twenty two minutes remaining. That was that, the Jammers up to eighth, Walthamstow down to tenth.

Bury Town, four games unbeaten and having scored fifteen goals during that time, welcomed Grays Athletic to OCS Ram Meadow – and quickly added yet another goal, Cemal Ramadan doing what he does best after sixteen minutes. Just after the half hour Luke Brown doubled the advantage for the hosts, and it was as good as game over when Ramadan made it three five minutes into the second half. Athletic tried to make a match of it, Kien Connolly pulling a goal back with sixteen minuets to go, but it was too little, too late. Town are ninth.

Witham Town hoped to get back to winning ways after two defeats, and they went ahead against Wroxham when Jeffrey Cobblah took his tally for the season to double figures - but just before the break it all went wrong for the hosts, Oliver Bell seeing red and Ryan Hawkins immediately levelling for the Yachtsmen. The second half saw two quick goals, one for each side, Andrew Cesay restoring Town's advantage and Ryan Miles levelling for the visitors - but that was that, the sides ending the day in eleventh and twelfth.

THE ORIGINAL BUFFON

Gianluigi Buffon is one of the greatest goalkeepers the game has ever seen. A precocious teenager so talented that when he broke into Parma's first team at 16, he was told he would be his country's number one by the time he was twenty. 'Why would I wait that long?' was his confident reply. But goalkeeping was in Buffon's genes. Some three decades before Gianluigi arrived in the world, and half a century before he sat atop it, his grandfather's cousin was making his debut for Portogruaro. It wasn't long before he was on the move to Italian giants Milan, where Lorenzo Buffon would become a legend.

Lorenzo's career started in the chaos of post-war Italian football. The first national

championships had been created under facism, and with the financial struggles of football following the war, that required a restructure. Despite a mid-table finish, Portogruaro were dropped into the vast, regional, amateur fourth tier, and turned to their academy for an immediate return to Serie C. Buffon would probably not have been given such an early start in a higher division, but at that level, he was given the gloves. And so nearly, he achieved immediate success. Portogruaro struggled to score goals, but Buffon's performance in goal kept them in the title race right to the end of the season. In the end, they were massively outscored by San Dona, who took the single promotion place, but the young goalkeeper had done enough to grab the attention of at the top of the tree.

Milan were in a period of rebuilding that would define them for a decade. Gunnar Gren and Nils Liedholm joined their Swedish compatriot Gunnar Nordahl in the famous Gre-No-Li attacking line, which meant the signing of a backup goalkeeper happened without much fanfare at all. Content to warm the bench as a profession, Buffon had to wait until January of 1950 to make his debut for the Rossoneri. He stood out in a 5-1 win, and was given a second game, then a third, a game against Juventus which was the first Serie A game to be televised live. Milan destroyed their opponents, winning 7-1, and while the super Swedes took the headlines, Buffon was now undroppable.

Despite their win, Milan failed to take the Scudetto away from Turin until the following season, when they were so dominant that they failed to win any of their final five games, and still secured the title. The power was shifting to the city, and Inter made their own claim on the Italian title, bolstered by their own young goalkeeper Giorgio Ghezzi. He and Buffon developed a rivalry both on and off the pitch.

Ghezzi went to the World Cup in 1954 as first choice, owing to Inter's back-to-back titles, but a poor showing soon had the Azzurri turning to Buffon. Ghezzi suffered a double blow. Edy Campagnoli was a catwalk model and tv star, and Ghezzi's girlfriend. But when he was dropped by the national team, she dropped him as well. In a move that could have come straight from her tv shows, she ended up in Buffon's arms. They married in 1958, and Ghezzi reportedly never recovered from the rejection.

Mllan returned to title-winning form following the World Cup, and qualified for the European



Cup. He saw them to another title in 1957, and Milan made the European Cup final in 1958, but without an injured Buffon in goal they conceded 3 and lost in injury time to Real Madrid.

In fact, injuries would prove to be his downfall. Following that European Cup defeat, the Milan board started to question Buffon's injury record and looking for a replacement. He played one more season for the Rossoneri before another soap-opera twist. Ghezzi, following his heartbreak, had left the city of Milan on the eve of Buffon and Campagnoli's wedding and spent a year at Genoa. Milan made their move and brought him in. Buffon went the other way, and was unable to prevent his new side's relegation, because once again he'd spent most of the season on the injury table. But Inter had struggled to replace Ghezzi, and saw an opportunity. He joined the Nerazurri, and resumed his rivalry with Ghezzi.

Juventus won the 1961 title, but all attention was on the Milan rivalry. Buffon and Inter won the first tie, before Ghezzi and Milan won the return. But it was less about results, and more about who would get that coveted number 1 jersey at the 1962 World Cup. Buffon suffered a blow in 1962, conceding the title to Milan and Ghezzi, but he had conceded the fewest goals. The call came, and he was off to Chile. He had won once again.

Sadly, after keeping a clean sheet in the first game, he got injured once more. Italy crashed out of the World Cup, and neither Buffon or Ghezzi would play for them again. Buffon won the Scudetto the following year, but his time was coming to an end. He retired in 1965 after short spells at Fiorentina and Ivera.

His cousin's grandson would eventually go on to surpass him, but Lorenzo will always be the original Buffon.
