It is fair to say that recent results and performances haven't quite been at the levels we would have hoped, a hard-fought narrow victory over struggling Stowmarket on New Year's Day followed by a very tough encounter last weekend at Brentwood when the lads really had to dig deep under constant second half pressure, defending a very boggy penalty area to come away with a very good point thanks to a 74th minute equalizer from Josh Mayhew that came against the run of play and seemed to take the wind out of Brentwood's sails, enabling us to see the game out.

As a club we have to emulate this and ensure we are in a position in future to offer similar pathways for our youngsters and give Felixstowe lads in particular the opportunities at their local club that otherwise they could only find by moving to the likes of Needham, Sudbury, Leiston etc.

As I have said to the management, this club can never sustain a large transfer kitty for new summer signings, so we have to get things in place to help develop our own stars of the future and help them progress from junior, community football all the way through if their ability allows. That has to be this club's focus, and aspirations for an all-weather playing facility, improved clubhouse, additional teaching areas for academy etc. are all part of what we are striving to achieve over the coming years.

Sponsors, volunteers, coaches, catering assistants are all vital to help us achieve our dreams – do you have a spare hour or two each week to give us? Would your boss or company like to help the club? We would love to hear from anyone that might be interested. Trust me, the satisfaction gained from seeing youngsters develop from our own juniors, through to semi-professional football and knowing "I helped it happen" is really rewarding.



If you have a quiet ten minutes, go to google, and look up Lowestoft – fishing – industry, then be prepared for an hour's fascinating read. It's an industry that is pretty much gone now, but it was once a thriving way of life that provided the bulk of our visitors' supporters down the years. The club history as provided by Lowestoft can be found elsewhere in this programme and this is not an alternative view, just some thoughts about one of the clubs who I believe are the very epitome of non-league football.

They pull in 700+ for the bigger games and average just over 400 for normal games and other than Bury Town, they have the rest of the North Division looking at their attendance figures with envy – I include ourselves amongst those envious ones but take some satisfaction from the fact we are getting there! We are up to the mid 350 average for home games and it's not so long ago we thought treble figures was a real good crowd and over 200 - well, that was brilliant!

It's been and continues to be hard work for Chris Daynes and his small band of volunteers, but the sight of former players and spectators coming back to watch what is now a decent team, playing decent football at a good level must bring a great swell of satisfaction to that group who work so hard behind the scenes.

A good indication of how far we have come is that the TV cameras will be here tomorrow to record the Ipswich Town Ladies fixture, as the AGL arena is considered good enough to be considered their home ground. Yes, we are definitely getting there!



Felixstowe & Walton United remain in second place after a keenly fought local derby against a Stowmarket side whose performance belied their position in the table. **Billy Holland** opened the scoring for the Seasiders with a cool finish on

15 minutes and Josh Mayhew could have doubled the advantage but his vicious strike struck the underneath of the crossbar and down onto the goal line. Charlie Binns in the Felixstowe goal pulled off two spectacular saves to deny the visitors a way back into the game before the break. Felixstowe were struggling to put an end product to their build up play and the speed and enthusiasm of the lowly visitors was causing constant problems in the home final third. Elliott Ballard took advantage of those jitters on 60 minutes, finishing well when left in acres of space. **Joe Whight** was the match winner on 75 minutes, taking the ball down 30 yards from goal and unleashing a curling effort that flew over the keeper and into the net. There were still some nervy moments for the home supporters in the 561 crowd but they held firm and delivered three points despite being far from their fluent best on the day.

Felixstowe and Walton travelled to in-form play off rivals Brentwood Town, the away supporters looking forward to the first appearance of new goalkeeper Josh Blunkell.

The match started with Felixstowe in

defence under a lot of pressure with Felixstowe struggling to play any football on the pitch that was now cutting up badly. Brentwood pressure paid off when they equalised in the 63rd minute, Reid heading home. Just 7 minutes later they went ahead 2 - 1 through McKenzie after a melee in the six yard box following a corner, in which Leon Ottley-Gooch sustained what looked like serious injury and had to leave the field. Felixstowe had to dig deep and to their credit started to look a little more dangerous. In the 74th minute Josh Mayhew latched onto a through ball, rounded the keeper and scored from a tight angle to equalise. The game became very open and both sides had further chances. The closest either side came was a drive from Sam Ford that was pushed out by the keeper and a defender just got to the ball before Mayhew to put it out for a corner. The match finished 2 - 2 and at the end of the day Felixstowe were happy to come away with a point which their second half defensive display deserved.

## THE OTHER SIDE LOWESTOFT TOWN FC

Lowestoft Town have a fine history stretching back well over 100 years. The club is first recorded as East Suffolk F C with games, all friendlies in those days, recorded back in 1884. On merging with the original Kirkley club the title of Lowestoft was adopted in 1887 with 'Town' added in 1890.

When the Norfolk & Suffolk League was formed in 1897, providing the first inter-county competitive matches, Lowestoft dominated, winning the title 6 times in the first 7 years. The 'odd' season out 1899-1900 saw Lowestoft's attentions turn to the F Amateur Cup with victories over such famous names as Leytonstone (9-0), and Gt Marlow (1-0) on the way to the final which brought a 1-5 defeat by Bishop Auckland at Leicester.

In 1904 Lowestoft had to appear before a FA Commission to answer charges of professionalism after a testimonial had raised just under £5 for player Fred Timoney who was about to emigrate. Norwich City who had 'poached' 4 of Lowestoft's successful side amongst others were also called before the commission. Whilst City accepted the ruling and formally adopted professionalism to start on the road that has seen them up amongst the top clubs in the country, Lowestoft paid a restitution of 2 guineas to regain amateur status. In 1925 came the decision to adopt the blue and white colours that have served them so well since.

Lowestoft became founder members of the Eastern Counties League in 1935 but before starting out on this new challenge once again merged with local rivals Kirkley. The move proved a wise one with the first season seeing them sharing the title with Harwich & Parkston and then winning it outright 2 years later.

Lowestoft took the bold step of becoming semi-professional in 1962. & 7 ECL titles and twice runners up in the following 9 seasons is clear testimony to the manner in which they dominated in those years.

The ECL title was again won in 1977/8. The 1980s saw a decline in the club's fortunes as crowds and income dropped. The unique club pavilion, originally the Yacht Club before being taken down and moved from the harbour to the Crown Meadow in 1902, was gradually falling into disrepair and the floodlighting system installed in 1964 was coming to the end of its lifespan. The floodlights were updated in 1986 and the new dressing room complex occupied in 1989 and at last attention could be paid to playing matters.

As playing fortunes declined a 19 year old local lad signed for the club in 1980 who was to figure prominently in the affairs of the club for the next 30 plus years. Micky Chapman soon became a favourite with his all action style, eye for the goal, long flowing hair and a genuine desire to bring success back to the club. 5 'Player of the Year' trophies adorn his display cabinet as testimony to the respect he has earned from supporters and players alike. The 1990s saw Micky progress from captain to assistant manager and finally manager in 1994.

A persistent back injury forced Mick to hang up his boots in 1997 allowing him to concentrate fully on the managerial side. With the unwavering support of successive chairmen Mick had been able to improve the side year by year. In February 2012 he took charge of his 1000th game as Lowestoft manager.

After several years in the doldrums the 21st century has seen Micky team up with Ady Gallagher to bring a return to trophy winning days with the Ridgeons League title won twice, the League Cup collected twice and the Suffolk Premier Cup brought back to the Meadow five times. The culmination of all that recent success came in May 2008 when joint managers Micky Chapman and Ady Gallagher proudly led their squad out onto the hallowed Wembley pitch in the FA Carlsberg Vase final. On a blazing hot Sunday afternoon in front of over 14,000 Lowestoft supporters, the Blues were in the lead for three quarters of the game before conceding a last minute goal to lose out to Kirkham & Wesham by the odd goal of three.

Season 2008-2009 saw the first team win a League and County Cup double, as well as reach the semi final of the F A Carlsberg Vase and the season ended with promotion to the Ryman League Division One North. Success continued unabated in 2009/10 with back to back promotions seeing the Blues soar to the Ryman Premier Division at the first attempt achieving a century of points and goals for the second consecutive season. An excellent FA Cup run saw the first round proper reached with the run ended at Wrexham by a cruel deflected goal in the final minutes.

The first season in the Ryman Premier Division saw the Trawlerboys involved in the promotion race right to the end. There was just 9 minutes of the season left when Tonbridge Angels scored the goal that gave them a 3-4 victory and ended Lowestoft's hopes of a third successive promotion. It was a similar story in the following 2 seasons with late goals in the Play Off final denying them promotion before the dream of Step 2 football was realised in 2014 with a play off victory over AFC Hornchurch and a 3rd promotion in 6 seasons.

Season 2014-2015 was one of consolidation in the highest sphere the club has ever reached and despite several early morning departures and a mere 8500 plus miles of travelling a satisfactory season ended with them holding a 16th place finish suffering just a single defeat in their final 13 fixtures. On top of this the Blues closed their season out by winning the Suffolk Premier Cup for the twelfth time; beating Whitton United 2-1 after extra time. It was also a season that marked the farewell of a true Lowestoft Town legend with Micky Chapman retiring after the last league game of the season at home to Barrow, who sealed the league title that day with a 3-2 victory over the Blues. After 32 years, 480 first

team appearances, 193 goals, 1640 games and 147,600 plus minutes as a player, player/ manager and then manager during that time, it was the end of an era for a figure who will forever be etched in the history of Lowestoft Town FC.

Season 2015-2016 saw Ady Gallagher in sole charge for the first time but a season plagued with injuries saw the Trawlerboys relegated on the last day of the season on goal difference bringing a return to the Ryman League Premier Division. Season 2016-2017 was to prove one of consolidation as they adjusted to life at step 3 in a season once again plagued with injuries.

Season 2017-2018 proved to be one of turmoil as firstly Ady Gallagher stepped down to be replaced by his assistant Dale Brooks. The club was then hit by financial problems which saw the departure of several leading players but Brooks achieved a minor miracle by avoiding relegation with the remnants of his squad aided by a bevy of youth loan signings and the clubs scholar's.

Brooks stepped down during the summer of 2018 to be replaced by two former players Jamie Godbold and Andy Reynolds who between themselves boast over 900 appearances for the Trawlerboys. Having to build a completely new side Godbold has had to cope with three season bedevilled with injuries and covid resulting in relegation back to Step 4 and a move back across to the Isthmian League.

So a dozen years of non stop incident that has seen three promotions, three losing play off finals, 2 relegations and a 1st round proper venture and saw us travel as far north as Barrow, south as far as Bristol, west as far as Wrexham and Colwyn Bay sees as back to where this modern day adventure all started in the Isthmian League Division One North.

Season 22/23 saw Lowestoft restart their quest to return to Step 3 but in a season when they were rarely out of the top 5 saw their efforts just fail as they lost out in the play off semi-finals to Heybridge Swifts after finishing in 3rd place.



He then gained managerial experience with Harleston and Derham Town before moving over to the Trawlerboys.

## PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NORTH ROUND UP

It was a day of draws, but Lowestoft Town won't mind, as victory took them five clear. Bowers and Maldon kept up their fine runs, whilst Felixstowe drew at Brentwood

**NITCHING** 

Lowestoft Town had seen their lead at the top cut to three points after losing two of their previous three - but the Trawler Boys have games in hand over the chasing pack, and hoped to get back to winning ways as Brightlingsea Regent came to call. With Jake Reed in your side you're always guaranteed goals, and the Town number nine scored for the sixth consecutive match - twenty fourth time this season - to give the hosts the lead after thirteen minutes. There were only fifteen minutes remaining when the hosts seemingly made the points secure, Adam Hipperson making it two, and that security was helped when Regent saw Kojo Apenteng sent off - but the ten men hit back with two minutes left, Bradley Russell getting a goal back. It wasn't enough- and the hosts lead at the top was five points.

Third place **Bowers and Pitsea** welcomed **Witham Town.** Bowers were on the march, with six wins from seven, whilst Town had delivered some fine results of late, victory at Brightlingsea on Monday the latest of those, so this one looked difficult to call. The hosts went ahead on twenty six minutes, Ben Williamson keeping his cool from the spot, and the same player guaranteed three points late on, scoring a second. Bowers remain third, six points off the top.

Heybridge Swifts started the day with a seven match unbeaten run behind them, and were hot favourites against an Enfield side who had taken only four points from twenty seven on the road – and lost eight of their last nine fixtures. The first half was goalless, but they hosts went ahead eight minutes after the restart – although they needed the visitors to score it for them. Enfield then scored at the correct end, Callum Taylor making it one-one, and had a man advantage when Lee Noble saw red for the hosts with four minutes left – but they couldn't take advantage, a draw the final outcome.

Maldon & Tiptree headed to Ipswich Wanderers, the Jammers only three points away from the top five, and with only two defeats from their previous ten matches. Wanderers, in contrast, have been having a torrid time of late, and had lost their last seven matches, so it was perhaps no surprise when the visitors went ahead on the half hour, Jayden Gipson scoring his first of the season. The Jammers were two up nine minutes into the second half, Shane Temple provoking worship from the travelling faithful, and although the hosts scored a minute from time, Zach Pedro with the consolation, a consolation was all it was. The Jammers go fifth.

Bury Town travel to New Salamis on Sunday, taking with them the warm glow of winning our Performance of the Month Award for their victory over Lowestoft last month. Town have been in fine form, six unbeaten, a run that includes five wins, whilst their Coles Park hosts are also on the up, with only one defeat from their last four. Both matches between the sides last season ended level.

Gorleston, who must be contenders for January's Performance of the Month Award after that victory over Lowestoft Town on New Years Day, were back in Great Yarmouth and welcomed bottom side **Stowmarket** Town. That New Years Day win was the Greens first in six matches, whilst Stow started the day nine points from safety and were still looking for that first win of the season - but the visitors were quickly ahead in this one, Joel Simmons scoring after just three minutes. The Greens were level three minutes before the break, Ryan Curtis making it one-one, and we suspect that if Stow could make their own luck it would still be bad, as they were reduced to ten men on the stroke of half time. Will Wharton-Richardson seeina red. Perhaps things picked up for them, however, when the hosts joined them on ten men just before the hour mark, Luke Johnson seeing red and with nine minutes left the Greens went down to nine. ## AS A PLAYER AND A MANAGER

A pair of deaths at the beginning of this year remind us just how difficult it is to succeed at the highest pinnacle of the footballing world. Der Kaiser. Franz Beckenbauer, was the most successful European in World Cup history, winning as a player in 1974 (after heartbreak in 1966 spurred his career and introduced The Curse of Der Kaiser to break English hearts for nearly 60 years... so far). He added a second winner's medal as a manager in 1990, his first managerial role. More recently, Didier Deschamps has joined him in that rarified position, winning as a player in 1998, and a manager in 2018. But neither guite managed to reach the heights of Mario Zagallo, the Brazilian who won twice as a player, and then as a manager, and passed on 5th January.

Zagallo had a brush with the World Cup almost before his career had even began.

Joining America FC in Rio de Janeiro when he was 17, his early training was interrupted by the military service he was required to undertake. As a young, new soldier, he was deployed as part of the security force to the Maracana Stadium to witness Brazil's 1950 World Cup final defeat to Uruguay, a defeat that saw devastation across the nation, with the goalkeeper on the day burning the goalposts, and suicides recorded as being caused by the defeat. It certainly left a mark on Zagallo.

He rejoined America but was quickly snapped up by Brazilian giants Flamengo, where he would spend the first half of his career. A tough, tricky inside-left, he made his debut in 1951, and made over 200 appearances throughout the 1950s, culminating in a callup to the 1958 World Cup side. It was a chance for Brazil to put the ghosts of 1950 to rest, with an exciting team, the undisputed star of which was a 17 year old Pele. He and Garrincha were the driving force of the side, but Zagallo played his part. In the final, which Pele made his own, he added a goal to the 5-2 victory. Four years later, he played in every game as Brazil became the last team to retain the World Cup. But, unusually for a footballer, winning two World Cup medals as a player was only the beginning of his success.

Zagallo retired as a player in 1965, and became the manager of Botafogo where he had seen out his playing days. He saw immediate success, winning the Brazilian championship, just as the national side were struggling in England. For all their talent, they were unable to cope with such a physical approach to their ability, and were kicked and pushed out of the World Cup in the Group Stage, only beating Bulgaria. Despite the injustice, there was a feeling in Brazil that the best team in the world shouldn't have been daunted by those kinds of tactics. They turned to Zagallo, who could combine the flair of yesteryear with the gritty determination required in the 1960s.

He had been part of the revolutionary introduction of a 4-2-4 as a player, but it was time for a revolution of his own. That formation, he decided, was too brittle, so he dropped a forward back into midfield. Rivellino, who had struggled to find a place in the side before, was the lucky player this opened a door for. He repaid Zagallo handsomely.

The presence of Rivellino allowed Pele to demonstrate his prodigious talents, but that didn't mean it was an easy route to the final. A close victory over holders England saw them into the semi-final, where their 1950 conquerors Uruguay were waiting. Another close game saw Brazil run out 3-1 winner, exorcising any lingering ghosts. Their two most difficult games out of the way, the final was one of the most one-sided affairs in World Cup history, as Brazil ran riot. A pre-tournament bootcamp to get used to the altitude in Mexico City made them fitter and stronger than their opponents, and they won the game 4-1. Zagallo was the first person ever to win as both a player and a manager.

Relative malaise followed that success, despite Zagallo taking his World Champions to the semi-finals in 1974, and it would be a quarter of a century before Brazil sat at the summit of world football again. The man they turned was Mario Zagallo.

He had enjoyed a peripatetic career after 1974, splitting his time between jobs in his homeland and jobs in the middle-east. But as the 1994 World Cup closed in, Carlos Alberto Parreira realised he needed more experience. He called up Brazil's last World Cup winning coach, and asked him to join as his assistant. Zagallo agreed, and the rest is (more) history.

He remains the only man in history with four World Cup winner's medals, and when he passed on 5th January he was the last remaining of the 1958 World Cup squad. The most successful man in World Cup history.
