

endeavour off the ball to match our quality on it will be key.





THE OTHER SIDE WALTHAMSTOW

The history of our great club is not what you'd call straightforward. Having reformed on at least three occasions, we've played under seven different names, but can lay claim to being the second-oldest club in London, and one of the oldest in the country.

The initial Leyton FC was formed in 1868 when The Reverent Morgan Lloyd obtained a pitch behind The Lion & Key public house. The first Leyton played mainly friendlies, but did take part in the FA Cup, before folding in 1880 when they lost their ground.

Seven years later, the members of Matlock Cricket Club, based on Hoe Street established a football club named after the Matlock Villas, which overlooked the club's pitch. In 1894, Swifts moved out of Leyton, to a new ground in Blackhorse Road, Walthamstow. This lasted just a season though, as the club moved back to Leyton and changed their name to Leyton FC in the process.

The club won the Essex Senior Cup on no fewer than five occasions, and the London Senior Cup, as well as the South Essex League four times.

Leyton turned professional in 1904, joining the London League. The following year, Leyton moved to Osborne Road, which would later become Leyton Orient's Brisbane Road.

In April 1912 a loan by a donor was called-in, and without any hope of paying it, the club disbanded for a second time.

Only a year later a third Leyton was formed, but this incarnation was extremely short-lived. The outbreak of war meant there was essentially no one to watch or play for the club, and it was suspended.

The fourth Leyton was established in 1919, and it would be arguably the most successful period

for the club, now back at the Hare and Hounds. Leyton won the FA Amateur Cup (now FA Trophy) twice, and were runners-up on four more occasions. They also reached the first round of the FA Cup four times and the second round three times.

After a successful 1950s and 60s, things dried up for Leyton, and by the 1970s they could not carry on, so a merger was completed with Wingate from north London.

The pinnacle of this club was winning the Athenian League in 1982, but by the early 90s with most of the former 'Wingate' committee now either deceased or having had left, the newly-merged Wingate & Finchley requested Leyton drop the 'Wingate' title from their name.

By 1995, the Hare & Hounds was really beginning to show its age, and with Leyton not having the funds to bring it up to standard, a merger was completed with Walthamstow Pennant, with the new club being Leyton Pennant and playing at Wadham Lodge.

This club spent most of its life in Divisions One and Two of the Isthmian League, with no notable success, save for two London Challenge Cup final appearances. Its first season in 1995 saw the club finish 4th in Division One, but it was mostly mid-table obscurity after that.

In 2003 the club changed names to Waltham Forest and were bankrolled heavily with aspirations of playing in the Football League. Sadly, these never came to fruition and an Essex Senior Cup was the only thing to show for it.

Disputes with the then-management at Wadham Lodge in 2008 saw the club exiled for five seasons, playing in Ilford. The first season back at Wadham Lodge, in 2013 ended in relegation to the Essex Senior League for the first time in the club's history.

In 2018, the club changed names once more to Walthamstow FC. This kick-started the club and saw the highest attendances in many years, and a third-placed finish in the Essex Senior League, the club's highest finish since the 1980s.

After two seasons cut short by the Covid-19 pandemic, Stow finally secured promotion from step five by winning the Essex Senior League title in 2022, the club's first league win for 37 years.

The club have made a great start to life back at step four, losing a play-off semi-final in 2022, and finishing just one place outside the play-offs last season.

Former player Vinny Murphy was appointed manager in December 2023, and instantly endeared himself to Stow fans by deploying fast-paced, attacking football. A formation of 2-5-3 in his first game was a sign of things to come.

Vinny Murphy, Manager: Took over the role in December 2023 following an extensive non-league playing career. Had three spells playing for Stow across ten years, and also played for Redbridge, Enfield and Southend Manor, amongst others.

Tony Murphy, Assistant Manager: Older brother to Vinny, and now in his second spell with the club. A vastly experienced coach who brings a great passion to the management set-up.

Loui Hazlewood, Coach: A very experienced player, who played as a midfielder for Thurrock, Billericay Town, Romford and Aveley. Scored the final goal in 3-1 win for Redbridge over Stansted, which ended up securing the Essex Senior League title for Stow.

Stephen Walters, Coach: Now in his second season with the club, a valuable asset and key part of the management team.

Sarah Akhlaq, Physiotherapist: Returned to the club this summer. Was a key part of our Essex Senior League-winning campaign.

GOALKEEPERS

Lewis Greene: Returns to the club where he made his senior debut over a decade ago. An Essex Senior League winner with Hullbridge Sports, has also played for Redbridge and Brightlingsea Regent.

DEFENDERS

Kai Davis: Now in his third season at Stow, where he has become a real favourite with his combative and relentless wing-back play. Has also played for Westfield, Hanwell Town and Harrow Borough.

Alieu Njie: Former Blackpool youngster who signed for a second time towards the end of last season. Has also played for Potters Bar Town and Wingate & Finchley.

Jordan Peart: Electric wing-back who signed from Grays Athletic towards the end of last season. Has also played for Barking and Aveley. A former sprinter, who can also play further up the field in an attacking role.

Kevin Songolo: Defender who came through the youth system at Harrow Borough where he broke into the first team. Has also played for Tilbury, Barking and Hayes & Yeading United.

Te Wihongi: New Zealand international with eight caps who joined in Autumn 2022. Has impressed with his composure and physical presence at the back and has become a key part of the defence.

MIDFIELDERS

Ezra Agyiri: Winger who progressed from our cup-winning reserves, where he was one of the stand-out players. A pacey, direct winger who will be looking to establish himself in the first team.

Jaiden Babalola: Box-to-box who signed at the start of the season from Redbridge. Has also played for Romford and East Thurrock United.

Ade Cole: Club captain who signed towards the end of last season and immediately elevated the squad. A classy, box-to-box midfielder, he has spent most of his career in the upper reaches of the pyramid.

Louie Johnson: Younger brother of Bradley, who started off in E17 before making almost 600 Football League appearances. A tricky, direct midfielder, Louie won the Essex Senior Cup with Redbridge last season, and the Essex Senior League with Enfield the season before.

Johnville Renee: A versatile player who can play almost anywhere on the pitch, but will predominately feature in midfield. Signed from Hornchurch and has also played for Enfield Town. Was with Stoke City as a youngster.

Jared Small: A vastly-experienced player who joined from Harlow Town. He has played for Tonbridge Angels, where he gained promotion

to the National League South, as well as Brentwood and Enfield Town. Can play at the back, in midfield and up front, so is a key part of the squad.

Kymani Thomas: Tricky, direct winger who signed from Ashford United. Has spent most of his career playing south of the river, despite being a local lad. Scored on his debut against Lowestoft Town, and continued to impress in the second half of last season.

FORWARDS

Callum Ibe: Now in his third spell with the club, Callum can play anywhere across the forward line and in midfield, and has become a real fans favourite thanks to his work rate and never-say-die attitude. Scored some vital goals and recently made his 150th appearance for Stow.

Brian Moses: Rangy forward who is now in his second spell at the club following a stint in 2015 where he was top scorer. Has recently won promotions with Cheshunt and Redbridge.



DEFENDS LIKE BECKENBAUER, PASSES LIKE ZICO

On 11th December 2004, Argentina mourned the first death of one of their World Cup winners. Jose Luis Cuciuffo was just 43 years old, and had been hunting in the southern tip of the country. 100km from the nearest hospital, he hit a mound in the road, and the rifle that he had between his legs discharged, firing through his liver, and then ricocheting into his neck. He died en route to the hospital, the blood loss overwhelming. He would be remembered as an Argentine legend, and beloved by Maradona. That itself is high praise in the South American nation.

Born in Cordoba in 1961, Cuchu put plans for an engineering degree on permanent hold when he was recruited by local club Huracan in 1978.

He impressed enough in his first two years as a professional to earn a move to one of Cordoba's giants, Talleres, where he slotted immediately into the team. An underwhelming season from the club couldn't disguise the youngster's undoubted ability, and he made 43 appearances in his first year, securing a reputation as an exceptional centre back.

He moved on to Velez Sarsfield in 1982 - a modest team in the early 1980s - despite being chased by a number of other clubs. Over the next three years, he helped bring them into title contention, and in 1985 they finished runners up. Marshalling their defence, with his ability to read the game and play a pass, he wouldn't be out of place in today's game. That skillset was spotted by national team manager Carlos Bilardo, and in 1986 he was selected by the Albiceleste for the 1986 World Cup.

Cuchu was left out of the team for the first game against South Korea, but was drafted in for the second against Italy. His task was to mark Giuseppe Galderisi out of the game, the Italian already signed up to move to Milan after the tournament. He wasn't a prolific forward, but he was quick and tricky and it was a difficult introduction to the tournament. The game finished 1-1, and Cuchu was important in keeping the Italians at bay.

However, it was in the third game against Bulgaria that Cuchu really began to shine. Playing out of position at right back, it didn't take him long

to find his feet. With just four minutes on the clock, he stole the ball off of the winger. Getting out from under his feet, he played a long, deep cross into the box. Maradona would describe the cross as 'Garrincha style'. It looped into the box, where Jorge Valdano was waiting to head his side into the lead.

It won over the Argentinian captain, which was an important step toward keeping your place in the national team. Maradona's book *Touched by God* positively gushes about Cuchu. He was integral to the tournament with his captain's name stamped all over it.

In the following round, he was tasked with marking Enzo Francescoli. The Uruguayan was in a rich vein of form, being named South American Footballer of the Year in 1984, and then the first foreign player to win Argentine Player of the Year in 1985, with his 25 goals in 32 games securing the title for Los Millonarios. Not that any of that impressed Cuchu, who kept him quiet for 90 minutes to help his side progress.

He played in the game against England that was, once again, dominated by Maradona, but it was in the semi-final that he earned his captain's praise again. For the second, brilliant goal, Cuchu intercepted a stray pass from Belgium, and played it into Maradona in the centre. While the maestro strutted his stuff through the defence, the defender's run is often overlooked, but expecting the ball to be played back to him he continued. It opened up the defence just enough for Maradona to dance between the defenders and put a tight, difficult game beyond doubt. One person it wasn't overlooked by was Maradona himself, who acknowledged the defender's contribution.



Cuchu had a quiet, dependable final, but played the full 90 minutes as Argentina won the trophy for the second time in three tournaments. Cuchu hadn't expected to play, but had been a key part of the side. He moved to one of Argentina's great clubs after the tournament, transferring to Boca Juniors. His move coincided with the barren spell for the blue and gold, and domestic silverware once again eluded the defender. He moved to France in 1990, spending three years at Nimes and helping them into Ligue 1, before returning to Cordoba and finishing his career at Belgrano. He hung up his boots after one season.

When he died, there was an outpouring of emotion, and the great and the good flocked to his funeral. Maradona was full of praise for him, and in his book likened his defensive ability to Franz Beckenbauer and his passing ability to Zico. To even be mentioned in the same breath as them, and by him, is testament to his greatness.

Enjoy the game.

Bury Town take over at the summit, Regent go third and Tilbury fourth, Swifts hit five and Redbridge four, Jockeys beat the leaders, Borough get a first win, and Mildenhall win in East London

Basildon United's narrow defeat at Felixstowe in midweek left their lead at the top looking rather precarious, and they knew they'd probably need to get back to winning ways at **Newmarket Town** if they were to hold onto first place. The first half certainly didn't go their way, Josh Lee in fine form in front of goal- putting the Jockeys ahead with his ninth of the season on the half hour, and Troy Williams making it two-nil in added time and the second half didn't come with a comeback, Newmarket up to nineteenth and the Bees bounced off the top.

Bury Town played host to **Witham Town**, both sides aware that victory would take them to the top if Basildon slipped up. Bury had won all of their home matches whilst Witham were unbeaten on the road, but by half time it appeared that only one of those records would last the afternoon, the Blues two goals up, Ethan Mayhew and- of course- Cemal Ramadan with the goals. The visitors didn't give up, and a minute from time Deese Kasinga Madia got a goal back, but there was no late leveller despite their considerable efforts and Bury top the table, whilst Witham slip to fifth.

Felixstowe and Walton United have been quite magnificent at home in all competitions this season - so opponents **Tilbury** would have been glad that they were the hosts, as the Seasiders travelled inland. The Dockers were four unbeaten, having won three of them and come from three goals down to draw with Newmarket in midweek - and in Alex Hernandez have a player in fine form, and it took him only six minutes to put them ahead from the spot, his fourth goal in only five appearances. The Seasiders drew level early in the second half, Josh Mayhew with the equaliser, and it looked like the match would end level only for Hernandez to decide otherwise, heading home a winner a minute from time. The visitors saw Cameron Forde-Brown sent off in added time, a miserable end to a miserable afternoon. Tilbury replace the Seasiders in fourth.

It was six v fifth as **Concord Rangers** welcomed **Brightlingsea Regent**. Regent saw a four match winning streak come to an end with defeat in Maldon in midweek, whilst the Beachboys were five unbeaten- five matches which had seen them concede only two goals. Rangers quickly conceded another, Teddy Collis putting the visitors ahead after just four minutes, and five minutes into the second half Regent added a second, Christian Frimpong making it two-nil. That was that, Regent up to third as a result, the Beachboys down to ninth.

Walthamstow were back in East London after midweek defeat on the road, and welcomed

Mildenhall Town. Stow had won three in a row prior to that defeat in Cambridge, and they had striker Brian Moses in fine form, with seven goals this season, whilst Hall had lost four in a row in all competitions, and had won only once on the road this season. In the first half those statistics didn't seem to matter much, as it was the visitors who went in ahead at the break, Ben Nolan scoring the opener deep in added time and Hall, and Nolan, quickly doubled the visitors advantage, making it two-nil three minutes after half time. Mildenhall held onto their lead, and climbed to fourteenth.

Waltham Abbey travelled to take on **Brentwood Town.** The hosts started the day down in fourteenth, but had played three or even four matches fewer than the sides above them, courtesy of being busy in Cup and Trophy. They came into this one looking for a fourth consecutive victory, and of course had defeated Premier Division opposition in the shape of Cray Wanderers last time out. The travelling Abbotts got back to winning ways against Ipswich Wanderers last weekend, hitting their Suffolk visitors for four, but were still searching for consistency, having lost as many as they had won- four of each. The only result they were missing was a draw, and after a goalless first half they were half way to getting one of those, and ended up finally making their mark in the 'D' column as the second half had no goals, either.

Heybridge Swifts are our draw specialists, five of their nine matches prior to this weekend ending level- but by half time in **Wroxham** looked to have three points wrapped up courtesy of goals from Andy Fennell, Scott Sloots and Manny Osei-Owusu. The Yachtsmen pulled a goal back on seventy two minutes, Ryan Miles scoring from the spot, only for Mikey Faulkner to quickly add a fourth for Swifts. The hosts weren't done, and Freddy Lines quickly brought it back to two-four, before Ben Allen added a fifth in added time to send Swifts up to seventh.

Mid-table **Redbridge** welcomed **Sporting Bengal United** for an East London derby.

The Motormen had gone three without a win although the first two of those were draws- whilst United had gone six without a win in all competitions, including two defeats in the league but those losses were against the top two so perhaps that didn't tell us a great deal. Redbridge were quickly in front, Malachi Napa taking only five minutes to open the scoring, and eleven minutes later they doubled their advantage, Rodney Botuli making it two-nil. United struck back in the early stages of the second half, Damilola Olusesi giving them hope, but a minute from time Joseph Elliott made it three-one, and then in added time the same player added a fourth from the spot, the Motormen up to eighth.

Finally, **Ipswich Wanderers** welcomed **Haringey Borough** to Suffolk, seventeenth v last. Borough would point out that they may not have been bottom of the table had they not been busy in Cup and Trophy, and they went ahead in this one on seventeen minutes, Jorge Djassi-Sambu with the opener, only to be pegged back in first half added time, Kris Rose equalising for the hosts, who were four unbeaten on their own patch. Borough regained their lead four minutes into the second half, Derek Asamoah with their second, and they made sure of a first league victory when Joe Waight added a third- his fifth in eight matches- with twenty two minutes remaining. That was that, but Borough remain at the bottom.

EMIRATES FA CUP

We knew we'd have at least one Pitching In Isthmian club in the First Round as our next Fourth Qualifying Round tie featured two of them, as Horsham welcomed North Division Gorleston. The Hornets were familiar with the pressure that came with FA Cup success as they reached the Second Round last season, and they've got a First Round tie to look forward to once more, Reece Myles-Meekums scoring the only goal of the game four minutes from time. Congratulations to the Greens on a fine run and coming so close to a replay.
