

Without a doubt, the lads did themselves and the club proud, and for that, we are all immensely grateful.

There was no time to lick our wounds, as Tuesday saw us travel to Wroxham for a re-arranged league game. The first 15–20 minutes saw us playing some great flowing football, though without creating many clear-cut chances. Against the run of play, we found ourselves a goal down. Things quickly went from bad to worse, and within minutes, we were 2-0 behind.

I was standing with some Wroxham fans who were gobsmacked, to say the least, as they couldn't remember the last time they were two goals up at halftime. Over a halftime cuppa, I told their committee that I fancied us for a 2-2 draw—not necessarily because of our performance, but because I doubted they could hold the lead.

Thankfully, I was proven right. The second half was a tale of huff and puff, accompanied by some top-quality saves from both keepers. We clawed our way back to 2-1 with just a few



minutes remaining, and then Harry produced a couple of outstanding saves that allowed us to force an equaliser with the last kick of the game.

On reflection, it was probably a fair result. It wasn't a game for the football purists, but it was still entertaining, especially with the fantastic traveling support from the Seaside. A point earned could prove vital by the end of the season.

THE ISUZU FA TROPHY

I know it's gone for another year and our run in the competition had a bit of a contentious end, but I think we as fans should pay tribute to what this side have achieved this season and just what the club have achieved since our first game back in 2018 when we made our debut and early exit, losing 3-1 here at the Martello Ground to Grays Athletic in the Extra Preliminary Round.

Including that first game we have now played 20 games in the competition, winning 14 & losing 7, we have played some of the big guns of Non-League Football, AFC Telford comes to mind. Three years ago we lost in the 2nd round to a side that were six time winners of the competition and we played them on our turf.

We've beaten Hastings United (2021) when they were dominant in the Southern section of the Isthmian League, Peterborough Sports (2021) when they were on their way to the National League and Metropolitan Police (2020) A giant of Non-League football over the last 50 years.

So to this season, one where a serious promotion push is definitely the priority, we sailed through the qualifying rounds with a 4-2 home win over Basildon United, followed by another home game where we had to work hard for the win over Enfield, getting there 2-1 courtesy of an own goal and an 86th minute match winning penalty from Callum Harrison.

The third qualifying round saw us ease into the first round proper with a brace from Josh Mayhew and a second brace from Cameron Forde-Brown against Haringey Borough. Having managed to get three home fixtures in the qualifying stages, no such luck in the 1st Round Proper, away at Step three side Bishop's Stortford.

Sometimes you just have to sit back and say



"WOW" and this was one of those days as the side brushed their higher league opposition aside with a six goal salvo, one more for Cam and another brace for Josh to put us in the hat with the big boys.

National League South Boreham Wood Away, full time playing staff, geared up for promotion to the Football League, almost there a couple of seasons ago, they have had a wobble which brought relegation but are on their way back, currently ninth in the Vanarama National League South, two points off the play off's. at their place. That was the challenge.

A 17th minute opener from Josh Hitter shocked the home side and the Seasiders ability to defend gave two coachloads of travelling supporters something to cheer, and cheer they did. It looked as though there was going to be a shock result until the ref awarded an 84th minute penalty, converted so it ended 1-1.

The resultant penalty shoot out went in the home sides favour and our Trophy trips were over for another season, but fantastic performances and entertainment.

What do you think will be the biggest challenge about stepping away from the club?

The biggest challenge football wise will be having to adapt to how another team plays. Having been here for 5 years now I know the team's ethics and way to play so having to change that will be tough. On a more personal note, the biggest challenge will obviously just be, being so far from normality, family and friends.





Will you be keeping up with the team's progress and matches from abroad?

Oh 100%! Most of my games abroad will be on Friday evenings so I will have Saturdays and Sundays off. I will be asking Doug to make himself useful for once and FaceTime me from the dugout during every game so I can watch!

Do you plan to return to the Seasiders after your travels, and if so, when?

Put it this way, I can't see myself playing for anyone else other than the Seasiders so if I were to come back and play, it would be for Felixstowe, if the manager wanted me of course! I'm not too sure when, that all depends how everything goes

Has traveling always been something you wanted to pursue, and how does it feel to be making it a reality now?

Yes it's something I've always wanted to do. I'm very excited about it, but it is also a bit daunting. I also feel some relief because I was getting to the point where I thought it was never going to happen.





THE OTHER SIDE BRIGHTLINGSEA REGENT

A BRIEF HISTORY

Brightlingsea Regent, previously Brightlingsea United, have completed around 100 years of competitive football. Firstly, in the Border league, between **1908/1909** to **1970** when they joined The Essex Senior league for 20 years having much success, before going on to join the then Jewson League in **1990** and then back to the Border league in **2001/2002**. Brightlingsea United FC and Regent Park Rangers FC amalgamated at the start of **2005/2006** season to become Brightlingsea Regent Football Club. During this time, the squad and club have continued to grow and develop, having success in the Border league Division 1 and cup.

In **2009/2010** new Management team James Webster and Mark Gridley guided Regent to a 4th place finish and followed up the following season in **2010/2011** by winning the Kent Blaxill Premier border league in a superb season by playing 34, winning 31, drawing 2 and losing just 1 game.

In season **2011/2012**, James Webster added Tom Rothery to the Management team in September and they finished their first season back at step 6 with a creditable 5th place finish. They also reached the quarter-final of the Essex Senior Cup before losing to League 2 side Dagenham & Redbridge. The **2012/2013** season was successful for many reasons. Firstly, an FA Vase cup run, which was the longest in the clubs history before bowing out in round 3 (last 64). The club gained promotion back to step 5 and the Premier Division with a third-place finish which included a 22-game unbeaten run during the season. In the final game of the



season the team won the First Division KO Cup final with a 1-0 victory over Gt Yarmouth.

The 2013/2014 season in the Eastern Counties Premier Division again proved to be successful for Brightlingsea, gaining promotion after finishing Runners-up to Hadleigh Utd, losing out on the final day by goal difference. The club also reached the last 16 of the FA Vase and in doing so again created history.

The **2016/2017** season saw Brightlingsea Regent crowned as champions of the Isthmian North Division, notching up an impressive 103 points and finishing 12 points ahead of their closest rivals, ensuring an historic promotion to the Isthmian Premier League.

In October 2017 long-standing manager James Webster left the club to be replaced by former assistant manager and coach Tom Rothery, assisted by Pip Boyland, who maintained the R's Isthmian Premier league standing and won the Essex FA's Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup.

2018/2019 saw the Regent achieve their highest ever finish in the non-league pyramid, along with their best ever FA Cup and FA Trophy runs. They also retained the Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup with a 1-0 victory at Maldon & Tiptree.

After Tom Rothery stepped down from the manager's position in September 2019, Colchester United legend Kem Izzet took the hot seat and avoided relegation in his first season in charge, In a season that was cut short in February due to Covid-19.

2020/2021 A later than usual start to the season saw Regent make an early management change as Kem Izzet departed the club in October, replaced with the management duo of Tom Austin and Ryan Salter, arriving from FC Clacton. The season was then curtailed in December and no more football was played.

2021/2022 Tom Austin and Ryan Salter resigned from their positions at the beginning of November with the club positioned within





the relegation places. The R's appointed Brett Munyard and his team of Mark Healy, Ricky Stubbs and Dave Limber who dramatically saved the club from relegation on the penultimate game of the season with a 3-0 victory over Haringey Borough to secure Step 3 football for the 6th season.

2022/2023 Brightlingsea Regent suffered their first relegation under the Regent name, finishing bottom of the Isthmian Premier Division following a 6-year spell and returned to the Isthmian North Division for the 2023/2024 season.

2023/2024 saw the Regent have a good start back in the Isthmian North Division, losing just one of their first ten games, a defeat in the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup to Billericay Town. Mid-season, Ryan Salter returned as Assistant Manager and the R's finished the season strong with a final position of 8th in the league.

Brett Munyard left the club in November 2024 and Ryan Salter became the First Team Manager, with Pip Boyland taking over the Assistant Manager position.

MANAGEMENT

RYAN SALTER – MANAGER

Ryan steps up to the manager's role after Brett Munyard's departure in November 2024. Ryan returned to the Regent last season after managing FC Clacton. He needs no introduction to the Regent having played 106 times and later became Head Coach under then manager James Webster.

Salts was an integral asset to the club when it was promoted to the Isthmian Premier League in 2017. He later left the club to link back up with Webster at Aveley before taking the role as assistant to Tom Austin at FC Clacton. Ryan is a dedicated hard-working manager who knows how to get the best out of his players.

PIP BOYLAND – PLAYER/ASSISTANT MANAGER

Pip rejoins the R's having spent the last few seasons over at Brantham Athletic where he was first team manager. The commanding defender needs no introduction to anyone at Regent having joined Regent from Stanway Rovers in 2016 after returning from travelling, previously he played several seasons at Needham Market. Pip was moved up to Assistant Manager and Head Coach when Tom Rothery was appointed Manager in October 2017. Pip initially returned in 2024 as a player but has now stepped up to the Assistant Manager position.

MARK EDWARDS – GOALKEEPER COACH

Mark joined the Regent in the 23/24 season as goalkeeping coach having previously been at East Thurrock United, Brentwood Town, Basildon United, Tilbury and Aveley. He looks to have been a solid addition to Brett Munyard's team with his excellent work with Lewis Greene.

BRIAN SWIFT – PHYSIO

Brian is one of the most experienced physio therapists in the area. He has been involved in professional setups and within non-league

football. Brian is a huge asset to the dressing room and management team and we are very lucky to have him at the club.

ALAN WRIGHT - KITMAN

Alan has been with the club for several years in different positions, he has managed and led a team through from Youth to Senior on two occasions at the club. Also, the Vice-Chair, Alan is always keen to help and get stuck in on and off the field, he is a fantastic club man who bleeds Brightlingsea Regent. He will be a massive help to all the squad over the next 10 months.

THE TEAM

GEORGE MARSH – GOALKEEPER

George joins the R's from Basildon United. George has an impressive CV including Isthmian Premier Division promotion with Cheshunt and a Golden Glove award in August.

FINLEY ADAMS – DEFENDER

Former Swindon Town and Ipswich Town academy prospect Finn is a left-sided defender that has impressed the management team in pre-season. He will add quality and depth and is another seen as a very bright prospect for the future.

MARLEY ANDREWS – DEFENDER

Marley joined Regent from AFC Sudbury where he, helped the club secure promotion from the Isthmian North division. The former Colchester United apprentice has also had spells with Maldon & Tiptree and Heybridge Swifts. Marley is well known to the town and it's younger supporters as he runs his own football coaching business which many of our youth players attend regularly. Marley is someone the club had chased for a while and impressed in his first season for the club.

ADAM BAILEY-DENNIS - DEFENDER

Big Mike came in from FC Clacton last season



and made an immediate impact within the back line. His strong, physical presence played an important role in the impressive end of season run. Unfortunately, he sustained a bad injury but we look forward to seeing him back in a red shirt in the 24/25 season.

WALKER SHABAZZ-EDWARDS - DEFENDER

6"4 Walker is a very composed centre back who is gifted with technical ability, great physical/defensive attributes and effective tactical awareness. At only 17, he will go very far in the game.

HARRY CRITCHLEY – DEFENDER

Harry joined the R's in the summer of the 23/24 season following a brief spell at Hashtag United. He's a 21-year-old left-back who progressed from AFC Sudbury's Academy and has represented both Coggeshall Town and East Thurrock United. He also spent some time on trial at both West Ham and Fulham after getting spotted during AFC Sudbury's good run in the FA Youth Cup a few years back. He picked up the young player of the year award for his sterling performances last season.

ZACK LITTLEJOHN – DEFENDER

Zack joined the R's from White Ensign and quickly became an ever present in Red & Black. His performances since arriving have been standout, earning him the Young Player of the Season award at Regent. Zack left the club in the summer to join Concord Rangers but returned in August 23.

The former Needham Market youngster, who went on to spend two years with Sunderland at the Academy of Light, joined Regent from FC Clacton for a short period in the 2023/2024 season before rejoining Needham Market. Cameron returned to the Regent in November 2024.

CHARLIE DURLING – MIDFIELDER

'Durls' re-joined Regent from FC Clacton two seasons ago having been away from the club for



4 seasons. Charlie's last match for Brightlingsea Regent was back in 2016 under manager James Webster, when he departed in the summer to go to University in Brighton. Charlie is a strong, tireless midfielder, who will break up play with his never say die attitude and being a Brightlingsea lad, he will put in everything on the pitch with his love for the town.

JAYDEN ROBINSON – MIDFIELDER

PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NORTH ROUND UP

Felixstowe get the latest of goals to draw at Wroxham, Newmarket hit City for four, and Maldon's new manager bounce continues

Felixstowe and Walton United travelled to **Wroxham** looking for a sixth consecutive win and to narrow the gap between themselves and leaders Bury Town- but in the end were lucky to take a point. The Yachtsmen, under new/returned boss Jordan Southgate once more, charged into an early lead, Craig Parker putting them ahead on thirteen minutes from the edge of the box, and quickly doubled it, Ryan Hawkins seventh goal in eleven appearances making it two on twenty five minutes, this one coming after a defensive error. That, it seemed, was that, and then with four minutes to go a Josh Mayhew goal- his eighth of the season - gave the Seasiders a lifeline, and they somehow managed to grab it. Six added minutes had been played when up popped Thomas Warren to earn the visitors a point, and it leaves them in third place, seven points behind Bury with two games in hand. The Yachtsmen are twenty first, four points from safety- and Stefan Peck's image shows how both players and fans felt after that late leveller. Football in a nutshell, eh?

Maldon and Tiptree's form under new boss Brett Munyard has shown a marked improvement, and they delivered a second win in two after coming from behind to defeat hosts **Haringey Borough** with a desperately late goal. Borough

went ahead midway through the first half, Georgios Aresti scoring his fifth of the season, only for one of the Jammers new arrivals, Darren Phillips, to draw his side level on the hour. Haringey have become rather good at losing matches from a winning position, but it looked as if they'd take a point from this one, only for Phillips to decide otherwise. There were six added minutes on the clock when the Jammers defender popped up with his third goal in two matches, this one an effort from distance, and earned his new side three more points right at the death. Maldon are up to seventeenth, Borough two points from safety in nineteenth.

There were only nine minutes on the clock when Jayden Randell put **Cambridge City** ahead at **Newmarket Town**, but that was the best moment of the night for the visitors, who spent much of the rest of the match chasing their tails. Ten minutes before half time Ben Robinson levelled for the Jockeys, and they were ahead at the break, Stan Leech making it two-one in added time. Leech enjoyed scoring so much that he wanted to do it again, and it took him only two minutes of the second half to do just that and make it three-one, and the hosts added a fourth fifteen minutes from time, Efraim Co Romanos making the points entirely safe. Jack Thompson had the last word for City, bringing it back to four-two, but it was comfortable for the Jockeys, who close to within two points of safety - and to within three points of sixteenth place City.

DAVID IN A LAND OF GOLIATHS

'The best ideas are made in pubs'. Or so goes the old Czech saying. So when, a few months after the conclusion of the Second World War, nine men met in U Kovore pub in a village deep in hops-growing country, 50 miles to the west of Prague, it's no surprise that the best idea they ever had was that they needed a football team to represent themselves and their neighbours. A whip round the residents raised the equivalent of £3000 for a blue and yellow kit, and so Blišný founded a football team, appropriately named Chmel; hops. Half a century later, with a population of less than 400, that tiny village very nearly upset the established European order.

The village team were happy playing in the lowest reaches of the Czech league system. With such a tiny local population, it would have been near-impossible for them to achieve any notable success. They developed players from the village, occasionally bringing in outsiders, and lived and died, like most non-league teams, on the efforts of their volunteers. The nearest town, Zatec, only has 19,000 residents, just enough to support their own team in the lower leagues. So when goalkeeper Frantisek Chvalovsky joined their youth team, it is fair to say nobody would guess how he would change the fortunes of Chmel. He graduated to the first team, and spent his two decade career with the club, making connections in the local and then national FA, whilst building a successful business career. He bought the club in the mid 1980s, and was appointed chairman of the Czech FA in 1991. He only hung up his gloves after achieving all that, in 1993.

During his time as his country's chief administrator he oversaw a golden period of Czech

football, culminating in the side's defeat in the final of Euro 96. His business interests, meanwhile, were booming, bringing in €100m each year. He bought the club he had played for, ploughing money in with a serious ambition; reach the top flight, if only for one season. Remarkably, with his ambition and his money, it worked.

Chmel progressed up the leagues in the 1990s, settling in the second tier, until the arrival of Miroslav Beranek in 1996. The manager had lost his job at Czech giants Slavia Prague the previous season for failing to win the league, and Chvalovsky paid handsomely for his services. Alongside the owners generous investment, the club worked hard to develop young players and sell them on for significant profit. Following Beranek's arrival, Jan Simak became the first high profile player to join the club, from top flight Ceske Budejovice. By 1998, Chmel were winning promotion to the top flight.

Chvalovsky had initially intended for his club to spend 'at least one season' amongst the Czech elite, but exceptional recruitment meant they were destined for much greater heights. First up was goalkeeper Ales Chvalovsky; the



owner's son. The media cried nepotism, but Ales had established himself as a regular in the U21 national side, losing the Euro U21 final in 2000 and 2001. He was first choice for Chmel's first season in the top flight, and spent seven years in that division before moving to Cyprus. Future Czech international Vaclav Drobny joined him, and Chmel surprised everyone by not only surviving relegation, but fighting their way into the European places. The 1999-2000 season would see the tiny village of 400 people represented in the Intertoto Cup.

A teenage Petr Cech was recruited for that European campaign, and unsurprisingly lifted the performances to a whole new level. The quiet rolling hills around Blšany were perfect for training retreats, so Chvalovsky invested €3.6m in a hotel complex, bringing in welcome additional revenue for the club. Everton, Marseille and Bayern were among the visitors. As the season started, other European sides made their way to the 4000 seater Mestsky Stadium. Belorussians Dnepr Mogilev were dispatched 8-2 over two legs before Kalamata made the trip from Greece

to concede just as many, without scoring. Chmel found themselves in the semi-finals of the Intertoto Cup, but compatriots Sigma Olomouc proved too much for them.

The following season, Chmel once again got to the semi-finals but lost, in heartbreaking circumstances, to Brescia. But the good times were beginning to end. Petr Cech was sold to Sparta Prague for €750,000, and a further half a million when he moved to France. Drobny went direct to Strasbourg for €1m. Jan Simak moved to Germany for €1.25. And Chvalovsky, ever the maverick character, was arrested for fraud. Chmel held their ground in the top flight for a while, but once the decline came, it was fast and it was terminal.

The village team finally suffered relegation in 2006. It was the first of four relegations in four years as funding in the side collapsed. Despite attempts to revive their fortunes, in 2016, with no new funding and difficulty attracting players, Chmel announced their ultimate demise, and ceased to exist.

They were, for a time, the smallest settlement in Europe to host a top-flight team, and were a goal away from a European final in 2001. They proved that David can compete with a whole host of Goliaths, but when it goes wrong, Goliath exacts punishing revenge.

Enjoy the game.


